

Even though the increase for the "customer charge" portion of my service bill will be phased in over a two year period, the change from \$8.40/month to \$13.40/month and finally \$18.40/month in 2018 is outrageous – this is an increase of nearly %120!

This is a fixed and not a usage based charge and is in addition to the other charges I pay above and beyond my actual usage which is the "generation charge". The other charges, "transmission service", "distribution service", "retail stability rider", "deferred asset phase-in rider" and "power purchase agreement rider" are also a significant cost for me.

The increase of the "customer charge" comes on top of the latest increase for the "power purchase agreement rider" which also increased an outrageous amount of %33.


