

In raising a family, there are many costs that are unavoidable, such as diabers and daycare. There are also unavoidable costs involved with owning a home, such as utility bills and home maintenance. However, in both instances, families attempt to keep their out of pocket costs down as much as possible. The reason is plain and simple. To understand what I mean, simply look at the average increase in wages compared to...well...anything else! I've heard estimates that college tuition have increase something like 1,700%, since I was in school. The cost of a modest car is more than four times the cost as when I was younger. Per the U.S. Census Bureau, median household income has increased just over 19:5% (comparing 2015 dollars to 2015 numbers); from 1975 to 2015. Since this basically represents almost no increase year after year for four decades, you can understand why reducing expenses and remaining vigitant is so important for families.

With that information in hand, the proposed "customer charge" increase by Ohio Edison of just shy of 300% is completely out of hand. COLUMBUS, Ohio -- FirstEnergy Corp.'s massive expansion and renovation of its high voltage transmission network is beginning to show up in customer bills.

Illuminating Co., Ohio Edison and Toledo Edison residential customers have been paying about half a penny toward the cost of the company's long-distance transmission system for every kilowatt-hour of power they buy. That's about to double.

The three Ohio distribution companies pay that money to a FirstEnergy transmission subsidiary, American Transmission Systems, Inc., or ATSI.

ATSI in 2014 spent \$1.3 billion on 1,100 transmission projects approved by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission.

Now the rate will be closer to a penny per kilowatt-hour -- actually 0.9609 cents per kilowatt-hour, up from 0.4030 cents.

A customer using 1,000 kilowatt-hours a month would see transmission charges increase from \$4.03 a month to \$9.60.

The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio on Tuesday ruled the increase would become effective whenever the company files the necessary paperwork.

Commercial and industrial customers will also see increases.

"This is a pass-through charge," said FirstEnergy spokeswoman Diane Francis. In other words, the Illuminating Co., Ohio Edison or Toledo Edison does not keep the money.

The little fee is one of up to 39 "rate riders" that the company -- with approval of the PUCO -- adds to or credits from the base rates. The riders are adjusted quarterly or annually. They do not appear on a customer's bills. Instead, what the customer sees is a total for the month called a "Distribution Related Component."

In the case of the rider to pay for the transmission system, the cost is folded into a line item called "Cost Recovery Charges" on a customer's bill.





I am writing you concerning Case Number 17-0334-EL-ATA in which First Energy is asking you to approve of an increase in their upfront, mandatory residential fixed fee on its residential customers.
