It is an often overlooked fact that, since few people can just ask an employer for more money each month or are able to spend without budgeting, most of us live on some kind of fixed income. The request by AEP to add a fixed rate charge to residential electric bills means difficult decisions for many who live on an unchanging amount each month and is especially hard on those with low incomes, seniors, retirees, and minimum wage workers.

Utilities, like most businesses, must project into their future concerning investments, changes of direction for the company, advancements in technology and changing opportunities and requirements. 
