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

What we *don't* like are rising bills for reasons not our own. Regardless of the energy required to power our TV's, cool and heat our homes or keep our lights on, it's expected that power companies will be competitive in their pricing to want to keep their customers. Raising the base payment to reflect not being able to keep up with the times is not a solution; it's a surefire way to lose your customer base.

We entertain the idea of changing to cleaner fuels to power our everyday lives. Instead of raising costs because of a failed endeavor with coal, why not focus on endorsing new ideas and resolutions to change with the times? 
