




Dear Commissioners,

I am writing to ask you to reconsider your decision to allow increased mandatory residential fixed fees by electric utility companies. These funds appear to be mainly used to offset losses from coal and nuclear plants owned by the electric utilities. However, that amounts to an exploitation of a monopoly by these companies where the profits belong to the company and the losses to the customers. That is not how the "free market" is supposed to work. If these companies made wrong investment decisions then they should bear the costs.

Another argument against allowing high fixed fees is that they discourage energy savings upgrades by consumers and therewith impact the long-term energy future of Ohio. I would like to see Ohio move in the direction of greater efficiency and renewal energy. I urge you as our representatives to implement a strategy that achieves this goal.
