We are aware that there is a proposal to raise the "customer charge" from \$6 to \$22.77 per month which is almost 4 times the current charge. This is unacceptable and I urge you to not approve this proposal.

As an Ohio resident, home owner and family of 8 this type of increase has a major effect on our monthly budget. And as a family with 2 medically fragile children we are already cutting back to the extreme to meet the health cost of our children's medical attention and there is absolutely no room for us to cut in our budget unless it directly affects the medical bills which would include medication to control seizures for our child or reduce the amount of money available for our son's special dietary needs due to an autoimmune disease.

Additionally, while we'd like to invest in the energy saving upgrades and have done so over the years as funds permitted, our further efforts to invest in these types of upgrades will be thwarted with rising costs of customer fees as it will inhibit our ability to save for future energy upgrades.
