ENTRY

{¶ 1} On February 27, 2017, Clean Energy Future-Oregon (CEF) filed a pre-application notice with the Ohio Power Siting Board (Board) indicating its intent to file an application to construct an electric generation facility. CEF describes the proposed generation facility as a 955 megawatt gas-fired, combined cycle power facility consisting of two natural gas fired, high efficiency combustion turbines, with two heat recovery steam generators and a single steam turbine. The proposed facility will be served by natural gas from one or more pipelines and will be interconnected to adjacent 138 and 345 kilovolt transmission lines. The proposed generation facility will be located in Lucas County, Ohio. Thereafter, CEF filed its formal application on April 19, 2017.

{¶ 2} By Entry issued on June 27, 2017, the administrative law judge established the effective filing date of the application as June 28, 2017, and put forth a procedural schedule. As part of the procedural schedule, motions to intervene were to be filed up to 30 days following publication of the notice required by Ohio Adm.Code 4906-3-09.

{¶ 3} On July 24, 2017, Oregon Clean Energy, LLC (OCE) filed a motion to intervene. OCE asserts it operates an electric generation facility on a 30-acre tract immediately adjacent to the property on which CEF proposes to construct its electric generation facility. OCE maintains that it is generally not opposed to CEF's proposed facility but has concerns that the operations of CEF's facility may interfere with the operation of the OCE facility. Therefore, OCE avers it has a real and substantial interest in

this proceeding and meets the criteria set forth in R.C. 4903.221(B) and Ohio Adm.Code 4906-2-12(B) for intervention.

{¶ 4} CEF filed a response on August 8, 2017, indicating it does not oppose OCE's motion to intervene.

{¶ 5} For good cause shown, the administrative law judge finds OCE's motion to intervene should be granted.

{¶ 6} It is, therefore,

{¶ 7} ORDERED, That OCE's motion to intervene be granted. It is, further,

{¶ 8} ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served upon all parties and interested persons of record.
