and down the court. Some shoving escalated matters and Mirotić once moved in Portis' direction. And then Portis landed the lone punch, which placed Mirotić on the ground for several minutes before his hospital trip.

Mirotić had bulked up to 260 pounds this season to improve both his post play and defense. That weight gain will be challenged by this type of injury, which typically renders a player unable to eat solid food initially.

In that sense, the injury will mirror Mirotić's February 2016 saga. That's when a botched appendectomy caused a hematoma that required a second, emergency surgery. Mirotić lost close to 20 pounds then.

Mirotić signed a two-year, \$27 million deal that contains a team option for the

second season just before the start of training camp. He all along had expressed his desire to return to the Bulls and skipped his Spanish national team commitment for the first time to prepare for this season.

"I'm excited for this season," Mirotić said after the Bulls' exhibition finale Friday. "I've put a lot of work in and think I will do great things."

Portis drew consistent raves for his tireless offseason work ethic and reported to camp in great shape. He drew the start in the first exhibition, in part to reward him for his offseason commitment, one source said.

But Mirotić and Markieff Morris, who was taken add the long-distance shooting element that Hoiberg favors. Even before this incident, signs pointed to Portis possibly being the odd man out ultimately in the rotation.

The Bulls consistently had stressed the word "culture"

throughout training camp in the wake of the Jimmy Butler trade. That culture centered on hard work and competitiveness. Both were on display during the scrimmage before the incident crossed the line.

How the Bulls react to and recover from the incident will be telling.

Fights happen in sports. Bears center Olin Kreutz once broke tackle Fred Miller's jaw in a fistfight at a shooting range in 2005. Michael Jordan once punched Will Perdue in the head and, more famously, Steve Kerr in the face, producing a bloody eye. Kerr went to the playoffs and those Bulls teams won championships.

The Bulls are far from those goals. Their aims of competitiveness and respectability now must first involve picking up the broken pieces left over from this fight.

Elliott gets temporary restraining order

Dallas Cowboys running back Ezekiel Elliott is eligible to play again as a New York judge granted his motion for a temporary restraining order blocking the six-game suspension for violating the NFL's personal conduct policy.

It means that Elliott will be

back at practice Wednesday and be on the field when the team resumes play Sunday against the San Francisco 49ers after last week's bye.

The ruling is temporary and will last for up to 14 days. Elliott and his lawyers from the NFL Players Association will have to again plead their case to Judge Katherine Failla when she is back from vaca-

tion before or by Oct. 30.

The decision was made by U.S. District Judge Paul Crotty, who was filling in for Failla.

Failla will ultimately decide if Elliott gets a preliminary injunction, similar to what he got from Judge Amos Mazzant of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Texas.

"Obviously, I am the pitcher that I am because of all the experience I had in Japan," Tanaka said through an interpreter of a career that included a league championship in 2013, his final Japan League season. "But I think the biggest thing is that I was able to experience the 2015 wild-card game."

"I think that experience under my belt has helped me pitch the way I'm pitching now," Tanaka said. "On top of that, I think just observ-

ing what's going on out here, the playoff games, you try to learn from that as well."

Of course, Tanaka lost that 2015 wild-card game at Yankee Stadium, 3-0, to the Astros, on a night when Keuchel dazzled the Yankees over seven innings.

In their first playoff rematch, in ALCS Game 1, Keuchel blanked the Yankees over seven innings and the Astros scored twice off Tanaka in six innings, enough to forge a 2-1 win at Minute Maid Park.

Before the Yankees' late

rally on Tuesday, Keuchel was just six outs away from pitching the Astros' franchise to its second pennant, the first since they were an NL club in 2005.

Having succeeded in October, on this stage, is already part of Keuchel's resume. And it's a settling he's comfortable in.

"To have some boos (Monday) night, getting introduced, that was a nice feel," Keuchel said. "You get boos against the Evil Empire at (their) home turf, it makes you feel good because you're doing your job correctly."
