# MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF THE OHIO ENERGY GROUP

The Ohio Energy Group ("OEG") submits this Memorandum in Support to the Motion to Continue the Riders Included in the Electric Security Plan ("Motion") filed by Duke Energy Ohio, Inc. ("Duke" or "Company") on March 9, 2018. In its Motion, Duke explains that after a series of procedural developments, it is now uncertain whether the Commission will issue an order in Duke's pending Electric Security Plan ("ESP") case (Case No. 17-1263-EL-SSO, *et al.*) by June 1, 2018, when the Company's current ESP is scheduled to expire. Consequently, Duke asks the Commission to confirm that the Company's riders currently in effect under its existing ESP shall continue until the earlier of August 1, 2018 or the effective date of its new ESP.

OEG does not oppose Duke's Motion, but asks that if the Commission approves the Motion, then its approval order should explicitly state that *all* provisions, terms, and conditions of the Company's current ESP, including the large customer interruptible load program, will continue through whatever time period the Commission deems appropriate. Duke includes a similar request in its Motion,<sup>1</sup> but spends the majority of the pleading discussing the Company's riders, particularly the Distribution Capital Investment Rider. However, it would be unworkable for the Commission to approve only the continuation of Duke's riders without similarly

continuing all other parts of the ESP. Accordingly, the Commission should expressly clarify that any continuation will apply to the entire ESP package.
