As an unbiased energy advisor, Palmer Energy will continue to perform rate and budget analyses, evaluate demand interval and consumption information, review contracts, forecast future demand and consumption, author Request for Proposal's, procure energy; and make alternative program recommendations.

End-users enter into an agreement with the third party supplier or sign a Power of Attorney with Palmer Energy Company, or one of its subsidiaries, to act on their behalf to procure power.

As the administrator for an aggregation program, Palmer Energy Company will not invoice the end-user. End-users will be invoiced by their electric utility or third party supplier. Service calls would be made to the utility or the third party natural gas supplier. For questions or information regarding program management, Palmer Energy Company has a toll-free telephone number and a designated email address.



Exhibit B-3 Disclosure of Liabilities and Investigations

Palmer Energy Company has had no past rulings, judgements, revocations of authority or regulatory investigations that would adversely impact its financial or operational status or ability to provide services.

A complaint against Palmer Energy was filed with the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio on 5/21/2010 by Buckeye Energy Brokers, case number 10-693-GE-CSS. In the opinion issued on 11/1/2011, Buckeye Energy Brokers failed to satisfy its burden of proof that Palmer Energy Company violated Sections 4928.08 and 4929.20 Revises Code. On 2/23/2012, the application for rehearing made by Buckeye Energy Brokers was denied.


