Dear Secretary McNeal:

Tempo Telecom, LLC ("Tempo") respectfully submits this response to the Entry issued by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("Commission") in the above-referenced case on June 28, 2018. Specifically, the Commission directed Tempo and other eligible telecommunications carriers ("ETCs") operating in Ohio to indicate "whether they are willing and able to ensure that all customers served by AT&T Ohio in their respective service areas will continue to be served with the federal lifeline discount if the customer is eligible," and to "identify whether such lifeline service will be provided on a wireline or wireless and facilities or resale basis."

Tempo received its ETC designation to provide wireless Lifeline service in Ohio on June 11, 2014 in Case No. 13-1527-TP-UNC. Tempo intends to continue providing wireless Lifeline service within its designated service area in the state of Ohio, and Tempo affirms that it is willing and able to provide such Lifeline service to former AT&T Ohio customers should they choose to apply for wireless Lifeline service with Tempo and are found to be eligible to receive wireless Lifeline service from Tempo. As directed by the June 28, 2018 Entry, Tempo confirms that any such Lifeline service provided by Tempo to former AT&T Ohio customers will be provided on a wireless and resale basis.
