This letter serves to provide notice that the above-listed certificate issued by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio pursuant to the Ohio Revised Code, is due to expire on 1/12/2019. If you have already filed your renewal application, or if you do not want to renew your certificate, please disregard this letter.

Rule 4901:1-24-09 O.A.C. requires renewal applications to be filed no less than 30 and no more than 60 days **prior** to the certificate expiration date. If the listed company wishes to continue to operate under the above certificate, a renewal application must be filed **at least 30 days prior** to the expiration date.


