- Q. Thank you. So you turned your lights on to make the stop?
 - A. Activated the overheads. Yes, sir.
 - Q. Thanks. And did she come to a stop immediately?
 - A. I think it took quite a while for her to get completely stopped which is kind of unusual, most people pull over and stop in a nice safe location like that, that's why I stopped her.
- Q. Thank you. Did you ask the Respondent for permission to look at her phone?
- 24 A. I did.
- 25 Q. Did she give you that permission?

- A. She held it but she showed me.
- Q. And what did you see there?
- A. That's the last outgoing call I believe was 6:53 a.m., outgoing or incoming, I don't know if it -- which one it was, but it was call made --

- A. Level three, I believe the only violation was the operating a CMV while using a hand held phone, so that should be my only violation on that.

 - A. That would be the time that I witnessed the violation, versus the time that I had made the traffic stop. It's actually the time of the violation, it shouldn't be much longer than the time of stop, it only takes about --
- Q. Do you manually enter this time or is it automatically entered by the system?
- 15 A. I manually enter it.

- A. When I got -- I made the traffic stop, got up on the side of the vehicle, opened the door up, that's where I made contact -- we had, pretty much, a conversation like you and I are having.

- Q. Okay. So would it be fair to say too that most drivers in your industry use the parrot device?
- 8 A. The blue parrot, absolutely.
- 9 Q. Okay.
- A. That's what I normally use but it was being -- it was lying on my passenger seat being charged.
- Q. Okay. And does that devise have an observable light when it's charged?
- 15 A. Oh, yeah.
- 16 Q. The blue parrot does?
- 17 A. Yeah.
- 18 Q. Okay.
- A. It's like a ear thing that goes over your ear, then over your head --
- 21 Q. Okay.
- A. And there's either a blue flashing or red flashing light when it's on.
- Q. Okay. And the device you're currently using which is the one you were using that day,

- 1 | does not have an observable light?
- 2 A. Not this one.
- 3 Q. Okay.
- 4 A. This is my backup.
- Q. Okay. And why do you know that you would not be holding your cell phone in your right hand?
- 7 | Are you right-handed?
 - A. I'm left-handed.
- 9 Q. Your left-handed. Do you do any
 10 activities with your right hand, in your daily
- 11 life?

- 12 A. Depending if I can dial or if I have a "E"
- log that's also on the dash, that's it. I'm mostly
- 14 | left-handed, yeah.
- Q. So you would reach for those but you are
- 16 left -- if you hold a cell phone --
- 17 A. Left-handed.
- Q. Left-handed. Okay. And did you explain that to the officer?
- 20 A. No. I just told him, I did not -- I was
- 21 not -- I don't know what he observed but it was not
- 22 my cell phone up to my ear.
- Q. Okay. How many cell phones do you have?
- A. That one.
- 25 Q. One -- one line? Okay.

- 1 Α. Yeah. 2 MS. HENNING: May I approach the witness? 3 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: You may. BY MS. HENNING: 4 5 Q. I'm showing you your cell phone records. 6 Can you just describe this for us? What is this? 7 Α. It shows a one minute call at 5:58. Well, let's back up. 8 Q. 9 Α. Okay. 10 How did you get that document? Q. 11 A. I called home -- I called Verizon first --12 Q. Okay. 13 Α. And they said to get on -- I had to do it 14 through --15 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: What are we referring 16 to now? 17 MS. - Q. Okay. And have you had a chance to read over this record?
- 14 A. Yeah, I did, as soon as I looked online.
- 15 Q. And did it look accurate to you?
- 16 A. Yes, it does.
- Q. Okay. And so this traffic stop was initiated at 7:09 a.m.
- First off, the officer had testified that he had saw a call log for 6:53. Is there a -- such a call reflected on this log?
- 22 A. It was 6:32 and 7:51.
- Q. Okay. And who did you call at 6:32?
- A. 5:58 and 6:32, I called my sister for one minute to wake her up. 7:51, I called Versailles,

the company I am leased to, to let them know that I had gotten a cell phone ticket.

- Q. Okay. Is there anything else that you would like the Hearing Officer to know today about this situation?

It doesn't go by your home base, it goes by whatever time zone you're in because I asked Verizon that specifically. Because your phone automatically changes times, no matter what zone you go into so that changes your call log.
- Q. Well, that's not stated anywhere on this document, though, is it?
- A. No. But you can look on my phone right now and see what time zone I'm in.
 - Q. Okay. Thank you. You had a cell phone in your cab at that time you were stopped; is that right?
- 16 A. Correct.

- Q. And even though you're left-handed, you can hold your cell phone in your right hand, can't you?
 - A. Well, of course, yes.
- Q. Thank you. So what hand were you using to steer the vehicle while you were holding the phone?
- A. I wasn't holding the phone, I was using both hands to steer the vehicle.
 - Q. Did you testify that you have more than

- 1 one -- more than one device -- ear piece?
- 2 A. I -- yeah. This one and the blue tooth
- 3 | that was laying on the passenger seat being
- 4 charged.
