We have now seen AEP get turned down for a solar project from PUCO as it is not warranted as a needed addition to the state of Ohio power grid. So this leads me to a question, why the push for wind turbines in Seneca Country? We are looking at totally destroying the fabric of our community along with our visual appearance by installing these 600 - 650 foot turbines through out the Seneca, Richland, Crawford, Erie, Huron and Sandusky counties. From what we are being told at this time the total count could reach between 1200 - 1500 turbines by the time they are done, and for what? There are other and better technology than an intermittent production of power from a wind turbine that has to have a back-up power source. What happens to the airlift wing in Mansfield?

Here in Seneca County we have lost all respect for our local government from the two commissioners right down to the health department and the county engineer office, as they have told us "they want everything to go as smooth as possible for the wind companies" How is this in anyone's best interest for the county. And just like the land fill, who does the inspections? The people they hire and turn in the paperwork to the EPA. Self regulated. They have seen many fines, but nothing with teeth to either make them correct the problems or close it up. The only inspection with these "industrial Wind Turbines" is if they have a elevator installed. All of this needs to have a answer.

This is where the laws must change and quit giving these outside sources free run of our community. Our county requires no permitting what so ever.
