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# NOTICE OF PROPOSED MAJOR UTILITY FACILITY

Willowbrook Solar I, LLC (“Willowbrook”) is proposing to construct and operate the Willowbrook Solar Farm which is a proposed solar-powered electric generation facility of up to 150 megawatts (alternating current) capacity in Concord and Whiteoak Townships in Highland County, Ohio and Eagle Township in Brown County, Ohio. Willowbrook seeks to construct and operate this project within an approximately 2,200-acre area located along U.S. Highway 62, bounded on the east by Garvey and Overstake Roads, on the south along the Brown-Highland County line, and on the north along Seamer Road. The general purpose of this project is to use large arrays of ground-mounted photovoltaic (“PV”) modules, commonly known as solar panels, to generate clean and renewable electricity for consumers in Southwestern Ohio.

Located approximately 40 miles due east of Cincinnati, the Willowbrook Solar Farm will supply wholesale power to American Electric Power’s 138 kilovolt Wildcat substation which is located approximately 1.5 miles east of the Village of Mowrystown and 1.5 miles southwest of the Village of Sugar Tree Ridge.

The Willowbrook Solar Farm will generate direct electric current using solar panels. Direct electric current will be converted to alternating electric current and the voltage will be increased. The electricity will be gathered through a network of buried wires at a project-level electric substation. The substation then will increase the voltage and deliver the power through a short, buried transmission line to the utility substation.

Willowbrook has filed with Ohio Power Siting Board (Board or Power Siting Board) an application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need to construct the Willowbrook Solar Farm in Case No. 18-1024-EL-BGN now pending before the Board.

The public hearing shall consist of two parts:

- (A) A local public hearing in which the Board shall accept written or oral testimony from any person commenting on the proposed generating facility on February 19, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. at Bright Elementary School, 6100 Fair Ridge Road, Hillsboro, Ohio 45133 and
- (B) An adjudicatory hearing to commence on February 28, 2019 at 10:00 a.m., 11th floor, Hearing Room 11D, at the Offices of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215-3793.

The public will be given an opportunity to comment on the proposed facility.





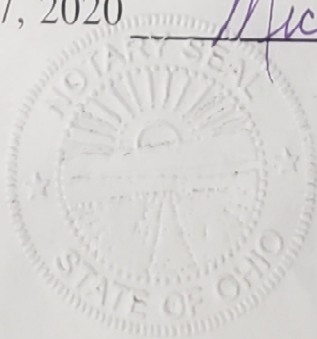

surrounded by people who don't understand what they need to be successful. Often they also feel that the community doesn't support them because they have a felony," Tengowski said.

"When we get people like that in here, one of our biggest goals is to make sure that they are working through those short term plans so they can achieve their goals."

Sometimes those goals can be as simple as basic survival needs. "I have put people on probation who are homeless. Nothing to eat and not a dime to their name. We have had to start at rock bottom to try and find them a sober living environment and some help," said Andrews.

Tengowski said the first few days of being put on probation are critical.

"Someone who is trying to get clean and do the right thing sometimes beats themselves up more than anyone. So any negativity from family members or other people in the community judging them over things that happened three or four years ago makes things harder. All of this can be an obstacle for people who are trying to get clean," she said.

"Having compassion and showing that compassion can go a long way. Helping them have goals and be a part of their own treatment is a huge step toward them being successful."

And small successes that many of us take for granted can make a big difference to someone on the edge.

"I've had people come in and tell me that they have paid all their bills this month and they are super proud of themselves. Something like that means a lot to people who have never done it," Tengowski said.

One way that Tengowski and the probation department are trying to help addicts and family members is establishing the Kindred Kare family support group.

The group meets the first Monday of every month at 5 p.m. at the Georgetown Church of Christ. This month's meeting will be Monday, February 4.

"The idea is to help them share their experiences and maybe educate each other. There is nothing better than getting together with like minded people working toward a positive goal," Tengowski said.

Andrews said that being a probation officer is a challenge, but there are moments when a client tells you something that makes all the work worth it.

"You saved my life. I've had people tell me that. What keeps us coming back to work are those cases where people want your help, they are being successful and they thank you every time they come in here," Andrews said.

"We have people that are off probation that will call us and tell us how they are doing because they are so proud of themselves."

## Still time for flu shots

Flu activity in Ohio is increasing and widespread throughout the state during this flu season. The number of flu cases typically peak between December and February.

It's not too late to get a flu shot, and the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommend that everyone six months old and older get one as the best protection against seasonal flu viruses. It takes about two weeks for a flu shot to take full effect.

"Flu vaccination is the safest and most effective way to prevent the flu which can lead to missed work and school, and cause other serious health complications," said ODH Medical Director Dr. Clint Koenig.

"Pregnant women, young children and people who already have serious medical conditions are especially at risk for serious complications from the flu."

Flu symptoms can include fever, cough, sore throat, body aches, headache, chills and fatigue. Although most people fully recover from the flu, some experience severe illness like pneumo-

nia and respiratory failure, and the flu can sometimes be fatal. People who think that they may have the flu and are pregnant, have an underlying medical condition, or who are extremely ill should contact their healthcare provider immediately. Flu vaccines are offered by many doctor's offices, clinics, local health departments, pharmacies and college health centers, as well as by many employers and some schools.

While vaccination provides the greatest protection against the flu, other effective ways to avoid getting or spreading it include: washing your hands frequently or using alcohol-based hand sanitizer; covering coughs and sneezes with tissues, or coughing or sneezing into your elbow; avoiding touching your eyes, nose and mouth; and staying home when sick and until fever-free for 24 hours without using fever-reducing medication.

Flu-associated hospitalizations in Ohio are tracking below the five-year average so far during this flu season. More information about flu and flu activity in Ohio is available at [www.flu.ohio.gov](http://www.flu.ohio.gov).
