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In March through May of 2008 the area around Bellevue, Ohio in which the proposed wind farm wants to be built experienced flooding caused by the water table rising. Residents in the affected area suffered property damage and 3 months of hardships. In March of 2009 the Department of Natural Resources Divisions of Water and Geological submitted a report on the ground water induced flooding. In the report they stated the Bellevue area surface and near-surface geology is unique. In other words the geological condition in the Bellevue area is unlike anything else in the State. The report made some recommendations for steps that could be taken to try to cope with this situation we have in our area. One of the recommendations was that local government agencies should consider mandating no permanent structures within the areas flooded and recommend no basements on structures located adjacent to these areas. I find it unbelievable 10 years later an entity would even consider proposing building structures that require the fracking and deep holes that are needed for the base of this structures in this geological area. Needless to say I'm against the project.
