

NOTICE OF PROPOSED MAJOR UTILITY FACILITY

Hecate Energy Highland LLC ("Hecate") is proposing to develop, build, and operate an approximately 300 megawatt solar powered electric generation facility to be located in Highland County, Ohio ("Project"). The proposed Project will be located on approximately 3,400 acres of land in Whiteoak and Clay Townships, approximately 25 miles east of Cincinnati, as shown in the map below. The general purpose of the Project is to install arrays of ground-mounted photovoltaic ("PV") modules, commonly known as solar panels, to generate affordable, clean and quiet renewable electricity for consumers in southwestern Ohio. The Project will supply wholesale power to the Stuart-Clinton 34-kilovolt ("kV") transmission line via a new 345 kV three breaker ring bus substation that will tap the Stuart-Clinton 345 kV line owned by Dayton Power & Light.

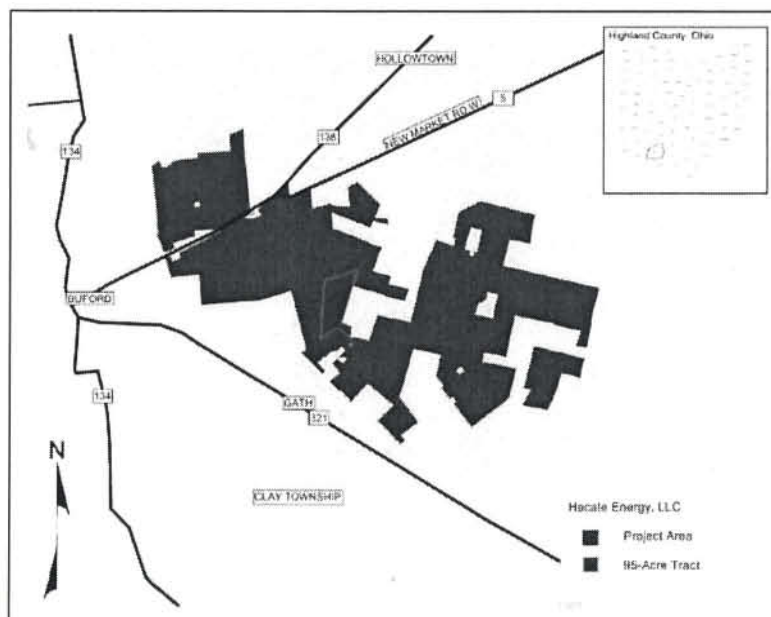
Hecate has filed with the Ohio Power Siting Board ("Board" or "Power Siting Board") an application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need to construct the Project in Case No. 18-1334-EL-BGN, which is now pending before the Board.

The public will be given an opportunity to comment on the proposed Project. The public hearing for this proceeding shall consist of two parts:

- (a) A local public hearing, pursuant to R.C. 4906.08(C), where the Board shall accept written or oral testimony from any person, commencing on March 19, 2019, at 6:00 p.m., at Whiteoak High School, Student Activities Center, 44 N. High Street, Mowrystown, Ohio 45155; and
- (b) An adjudicatory hearing to comment on March 26, 2019, at 10:00 a.m., 11th floor, Hearing Room 11-D, at the offices of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215.

The initial notice of this application as required by Ohio Administrative Code 4906-3-09(A)(1) was by letter dated January 29, 2019.

On February 20, 2019, Hecate filed with the Ohio Power Siting Board, a Notice Regarding Modification of Project Footprint which added an approximate 95 acre area parcel to the project footprint. The map below shows the location and general layout of the proposed Project, including the additional 95 acre modification.

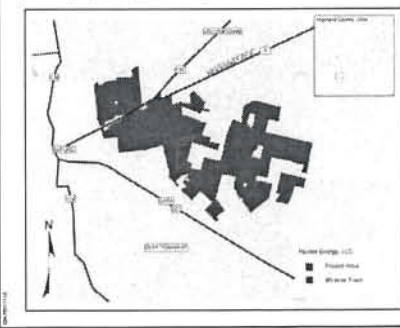

Henry and Duncan suggested that the county meet with "CERTE" the village of Leeburg and the school district. "We already have each party's role," Duncan said. "Henry could arrange that."

"Yes, but time is of the essence," Henry said. "March 2 is the deadline for the application."

At the commission meeting, March 4, Duncan, Henry and county clerk Gary Abernethy signed a letter of support for the project as requested.

"We wish to express our support for the CERTE/Sale Kermes to Hill County (SRTS) grant application being submitted by the Fairfield Local School District," the letter said. "A key component of the SRTS grant application is the development of a 'School Travel Plan' that serves as the framework for proposed travel improvements. We recognize the need for, and support the development of, safety routes to Fairfield Local schools as laid out in this plan."

Commissioners also heard a presentation from Appalachia Ohio Alliance executive director Steve Pleski, who spoke about the organization's recent purchase of the Roberts property along the border of Liberty and Washington townships as an "addition to the Rocky Fork/Lake Creek corridor portion of the Scioto River

Watershed Initiative."

The organization will help with the application to purchase and restore lands to protect water quality and riparian corridors along the South Fork of Rocky Fork and its tributaries, covering forest and habitat for native plants and animals, protect geology and scenic features and provide recreational and educational opportunities for the communities in the Jackson River Watershed, according to one of Henry's handouts.

"We're looking on the Scioto River as well as the Big Sandy Creek," Pleski said.

"We're also working on Salt Creek and Walnut Creek. Our emphasis is on clean water and protecting these riparian corridors, with water quality being the number-one goal and the second goal being habitat protection."

Specifically, Pleski said,

the organization is working on protecting Indiana bats, which he said are endangered.

"We're here today because we were contacted with ODOT as a mitigation project for Indiana bats for the state of Ohio," he said. "They have grants for acreage to be protected and targeted parts of Highland County as part of that grant for us to look at."

Pleski said the organization is seeking approval from local entities, including commissioners and township trustees, to apply for, and use money from, Clean Ohio funds to purchase property to some of those conservation areas.

Liberty Township trustees already approved a resolution this week, he added.

Henry and Pleski asked if the project would be taken out of the tax base.

"Some of our properties are tax exempt, but a lot of our properties are not tax exempt," Pleski said. "It's my understanding that this property (the Roberts property) is not tax exempt, so part of it is taxes."

"If it is an LRP and it is a wet area, we would not take it on. These properties, we do not file for an exemption on."

Commissioners voted 3-0 to submit a letter of support for the organization's Clean Ohio proposal.

Commissioners, along with Pleski, Henry and county health commissioner Ward Warner, entered an

executive session with Hecate Energy representatives, regarding economic development, at 9:29 a.m. They ended the session at 10:24 a.m.

In order to action, commissioners voted 2-0 to approve a resolution, contract and other items.

Henry and Duncan voted to approve spending an additional \$3,750 on a truck for Highland County EMA.

Duncan said that commissioners voted last year to approve the purchase, but due to some problems with Central Motors, they've been unable to get a truck built for it.

"In the narrative, we've been looking for a truck that's already built that would suit our needs," Duncan said. "We had specific things that we needed on this vehicle, so we struggled finding a truck to meet our criteria. However, we've just recently found a truck that pretty much fits our needs."

Duncan said although it cost \$3,750 more than they initially intended to spend, they may otherwise be forced to "wait for a 2020 truck, which there are no managers the price won't go up."

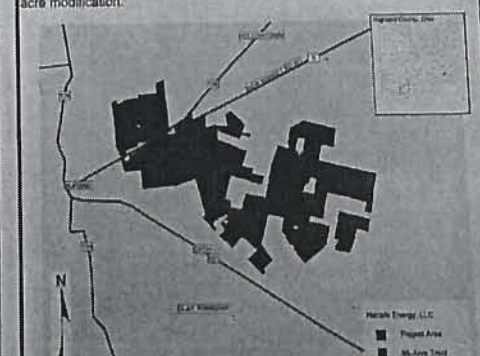

The Fayetteville-Perry School Board met in regular session on Feb. 21 and early in the meeting the board thanked board president Craig Smucker for donating his income back to the board to be used for the year-end banquet. Smucker makes the donation every year. The banquet will be held May 23.

The board accepted a \$2,300 check from United Way in partnership with the Success by Six program and the Eastern Area Ready Schools Collaborative. "We just began this year as a satellite school, in 6th and 7th grade," said board treasurer, Lisa Tussey. "This is our first year and Caleb Hensley is our instructor. Tussey said the district currently has several new bus drivers taking their training which is good for the district.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED MAJOR UTILITY FACILITY

Hecate Energy Highland LLC ("Hecate") is proposing to develop, build, and operate an approximately 300 megawatt solar powered electric generation facility to be located in Highland County, Ohio ("Project"). The proposed Project will be located on approximately 3,400 acres of land in Whiteoak and Clay Townships, approximately 25 miles east of Cincinnati, as shown in the map below. The general purpose of the Project is to install arrays of ground-mounted photovoltaic ("PV") modules, commonly known as solar panels, to generate affordable, clean and quiet renewable electricity for consumers in southwestern Ohio. The Project will supply wholesale power to the Stuart-Clinton 34-kilovolt ("KV") transmission line via a new 345 KV three breaker ring bus substation that will tap the Stuart-Clinton 345 KV line owned by Dayton Power & Light.

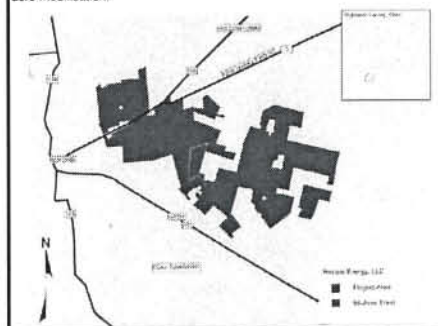
Hecate has filed with the Ohio Power Siting Board ("Board" or "Power Siting Board") an application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need to construct the Project in Case No. 18-1334-EL-BGN, which is now pending before the Board.

The public will be given an opportunity to comment on the proposed Project. The public hearing for this proceeding shall consist of two parts:

- A local public hearing, pursuant to R.C. 4906.08(C), where the Board shall accept written or oral testimony from any person, commencing on March 19, 2019, at 6:00 p.m., at Whiteoak High School, Student Activities Center, 44 N. High Street, Mowystown, Ohio 45155; and
- An adjudicatory hearing to comment on March 26, 2019, at 10:00 a.m., 11th floor, Hearing Room 11-D, at the offices of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215.

The initial notice of this application as required by Ohio Administrative Code 4906-3-09(A)(1) was by letter dated January 29, 2019.

On February 20, 2019, Hecate filed with the Ohio Power Siting Board, a Notice Regarding Modification of Project Footprint which added an approximate 95 acre area parcel to the project footprint. The map below shows the location and general layout of the proposed Project, including the additional 95 acre modification.
