ALJ ADDISON: Let's go ahead and go on the record.

The Ohio Power Siting Board has assigned for hearing at this time and place Case No.

18-1360-EL-BGN being in the Matter of the Application of Hardin Solar Energy II, LLC, for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need Issued to Construct an Electric Generation Facility in Hardin County, Ohio.

My name is Megan Addison. I am the Administrative Law Judge assigned by the Power Siting Board to hear this case. There are also Staff members from the Ohio Power Siting Board, Matt Butler and James O'Dell, present this evening. They will be available if you have any questions concerning the Application or any other general questions you may have regarding the Ohio Power Siting Board. Please feel free to approach them at the completion of the evening's -- of this evening's hearing.

At this time I will take formal appearances of the parties, beginning with the Applicant.

MS. PIRIK: Thank you, your Honor. On behalf of Hardin Solar Energy II, the law firm of Dickinson Wright, Christine Pirik and Will Vorys, 150 East Gay Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215.

ALJ ADDISON: Thank you.

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MR. ARNOLD: Thank you, your Honor. On behalf of the Ohio Farm Bureau, party of record in this case, my name is Dale Arnold, D-A-L-E A-R-N-O-L-D, Ohio Farm Bureau Federation, Director of Energy, Utility, and Local Government Policy, 280 North High Street, Columbus, Ohio.

HEARING OFFICER: Thank you.

The subject of today's hearing is Hardin Solar Energy II's October 12, 2018, Application as supplemented on November 14, 2018, to construct a solar-powered electric generation facility in Marion, Roundhead, and McDonald Townships in Hardin County, Ohio.

The project -- the project would be the second phase of the Hardin Solar Energy Center and would consist of numerous ground-mounted solar panels on approximately 3,297 acres of land. It also includes a battery storage facility. The panels will have a capacity to generate up to 170 megawatts of electricity.

The Power Siting Board Staff filed a report in this case on February 26, 2019. After conducting an investigation and review, Staff gave a recommendation to allow the project to proceed subject to several conditions. Staff's Report serves only as a recommendation to the Board, but the Board still has the final decision.

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This public hearing is only one aspect of the process for this case. An evidentiary hearing is scheduled for March 28, 2019, which will take place at the offices of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio in Columbus, Ohio. The Application and the Staff Report are available for review on the Power Siting website under the case number of this case.

The purpose of this hearing is to receive comments from the public regarding the Application in this case. I will emphasize that this is not a question and answer session. It is your opportunity to let the Power Siting Board know what you think about the proposal. There are representatives from the Company and Staff members from the Power Siting Board who I've already pointed out tonight who are available for questions after the hearing.

Tonight's hearing is being transcribed by a court reporter. If you plan to testify, please

speak clearly so that the court reporter can accurately reflect your comments on the record. Also if you have prepared a written statement, it would be helpful to provide a copy of that to the court reporter as well.

When you arrived, you were offered the opportunity to sign up to testify by Staff. I'll finish my introductory remarks and I'll begin calling witnesses forward that have signed the sign-up sheet and I believe, if we can speak loudly enough, you can just simply stand where you are seated. As long as the court reporter can hear your remarks, there's no need to move in the room.

Your testimony will be considered part of the official record in this case, and it will be reviewed by the Board before they make their final decision on the application. Additionally, the parties in the case and I will be permitted to ask you questions about your statement. Please answer these questions to the best of your ability.

Should you decide that you do not want to testify when I call your name, you can merely pass to the next witness. Also once you finish testifying or if you are just here to observe, you may leave at any time you wish or stay until the conclusion of the

HEARING OFFICER: Thank you. Please just state your name and your address for the record.

MR. VAN DYNE: Well, my name is Charles
Van Dyne. I live at 4794 County Road 80 which is in
Marion Township.

I happen to be in the northern part of it where I'm not affected by this project. Now, what I am going to say I realize has absolutely nothing, no bearing upon what this decision is going to be because, in my opinion, it's already been determined.

This ground that we're speaking of is going to be subjected to a solar energy project, but I am -- I am speaking just as a citizen of Hardin County, a resident very close to the project. And I am deeply saddened to see some of the prime land in Hardin County, some of the very best land in Hardin County for farming purposes taken out of production

for probably the balance of many years, many, 20, 40 years, maybe forever. And it's such a shame as I view it as a citizen. Why not locate this type of facility in a less productive agricultural area than taking our prime land and taking it out of farm production?

Now, all I am really doing is simply stating my own personal opinion and I have been opposed to this project since the first day I've heard of it and so tonight was an opportunity that I have in expressing my opinion and I thank you for the opportunity.

HEARING OFFICER: Thank you very much.
