The recent Duke gas explosion in Durham, North Carolina is an example of what can happen when something goes wrong with gas lines placed in populated areas.

I know that safety is not one of the criteria listed in the OPSB guidelines for determining your decision but I am appealing to you as a medical doctor to consider the wellbeing of the residents of our community.
