FINDING AND ORDER

I. SUMMARY

{¶ 1} The Commission approves the 2017 renewable portfolio standard compliance status report of IGS Dayton, Inc.

II. DISCUSSION

{¶ 2} IGS Dayton, Inc. (IGS Dayton) is an electric services company as defined in R.C. 4928.01(A)(9) and, as such, is subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

{¶ 3} R.C. 4928.64(B)(2) establishes benchmarks for electric services companies to acquire a portion of their electricity supply for retail customers in Ohio from renewable energy resources. R.C. 4928.645 provides that an electric utility or electric services company may use renewable energy credits (RECs) and solar energy credits (SRECs) to meet its respective renewable energy and solar benchmarks. Ohio Adm.Code 4901:1-40-01(BB) defines a REC as the environmental attributes associated with one megawatt hour (MWH) of electricity generated by a renewable energy resource, except for electricity generated by facilities as described in Ohio Adm.Code 4901:1-40-04(E).

{¶ 4} Ohio Adm.Code 4901:1-40-05(A) requires each electric services company to annually file by April 15 a renewable portfolio standard compliance status report (RPS report), unless otherwise ordered by the Commission. The RPS report must analyze all activities the company undertook in the previous year in order to demonstrate how pertinent alternative energy portfolio benchmarks have been met. Staff then conducts an annual compliance review of the company's filing and the records of the applicable attribute tracking system to ensure that RECs were sourced from generating facilities certified by the

Commission and were appropriately associated with electricity generated for the compliance period.

{¶ 5} On April 11, 2018, IGS Dayton filed its 2017 RPS report. IGS Dayton proposes to use a baseline of 1,624,645 MWH, which it indicated was its Ohio retail electric sales for 2017. IGS Dayton further reported that it satisfied its 2017 compliance obligations.

{¶ 6} On November 5, 2018, Staff filed its Review and Recommendations of IGS Dayton's RPS report. Staff reports that IGS Dayton is an electric services company in the state of Ohio, and thus had an RPS obligation for 2017. Staff reviewed IGS Dayton's attribute tracking system account record to verify compliance, and determined that IGS Dayton satisfied its 2017 RPS compliance obligations. Further, Staff recommends that, for future compliance years, IGS Dayton initiate the transfer of the appropriate RECs and SRECs to its attribute tracking system reserve subaccount between March 1 and April 15 so as to precede the filing of its annual RPS report with the Commission.

{¶ 7} Upon review of IGS Dayton's 2017 RPS report and the records of these proceedings, we adopt Staff's recommendations. We find that IGS Dayton's 2017 proposed compliance baseline is reasonable, and that IGS Dayton has met its compliance obligations for 2017. Further, IGS Dayton is directed to comply with Staff's recommendations for future compliance years.

III. ORDER


{¶ 8} It is, therefore,





