{¶ 1} On March 18, 2019, Ziwei Hang (Respondent) requested an administrative hearing in accordance with Ohio Adm.Code 4901:2-7-13.

{¶ 2} Respondent participated in a settlement conference with Staff on May 2, 2019, but the parties did not resolve the matter.

{¶ 3} Accordingly, a hearing shall be scheduled for August 1, 2019, at 10:00 a.m. at the Commission offices, Hearing Room 11-D, 11th floor, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215-3793.

{¶ 4} Ohio Adm.Code 4901:2-7-14(E) provides that a respondent who has requested an administrative hearing and fails to participate in the hearing proceeding shall be in default. The rule further states that a respondent in default shall be deemed to have admitted the occurrence of the violation and waived all further right to contest liability to the state for the forfeiture described in the notice.

{¶ 5} At the hearing, Staff must prove, by a preponderance of the evidence, that Respondent committed the alleged violation, pursuant to Ohio Adm.Code 4901:2-7-20(A).

{¶ 6} Following Staff's presentation of evidence at the hearing, it shall be the responsibility of Respondent to present evidence supporting his contentions regarding the alleged violation in this matter.

{¶ 7} It is, therefore,

{¶ 8} ORDERED, That a hearing be scheduled for August 1, 2019, as indicated in Paragraph 3. It is, further,

{¶ 9} ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served upon all parties of record.
