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MR. MARGARD: I will, Your Honor. I have spoken with Mr. Black and he will not be appearing today in light of the Stipulation resolving the issues in this case, and he has authorized me to offer an exhibit on his behalf.

EXAMINER SEE: Okay. Then go ahead and proceed, Mr. Margard.

MR. MARGARD: Thank you, Your Honor.

As a preliminary matter, I have marked for purposes of identification and provided the Bench and the court reporter with four documents.

I have marked as Staff Exhibit No. 1, the Financial Audit of the Gas Cost Recovery Mechanisms for the Costs Incurred and Included for Recovery for the Months August 1, 2016 through July 31, 2018, docketed in Case No. 19-217-GA-GCR, on March 29th, 2019.

I have marked as Staff Exhibit No. 2, the Audit of the Uncollectible Expense Mechanisms for the Periods January 2017 through December 2018 for the Waterville Gas & Oil Company, docketed on March 29th, 2019, in Case No. 19-317-GA-UEX.

6 I have marked as Joint Exhibit No. 1, the 1 2 Stipulation and Recommendation filed in this case. 3 And I have marked as Waterville Exhibit No. 1, the Certificate of Publication that I 4 5 have been authorized to offer on behalf of Mr. Black 6 and the Waterville Gas & Oil Company. 7 EXAMINER SEE: Okay. MARGARD: Thank you, Your Honor. 17 18 ROGER L. SARVER 19 being first duly sworn, as prescribed by law, was 20 examined and testified as follows: 2.1 DIRECT EXAMINATION 22 By Mr. Margard: 23 Sir, can you please state your name and Q. 24 by whom you're employed. 25 Α. Roger L. Sarver. I'm employed by the

- Public Utilities Commission of Ohio.
- Q. Mr. Sarver, did you have any responsibility for the documents that have been marked as Staff Exhibits 1 and 2 in this case?
- A. Yes. I directly prepared Exhibit 1 and then reviewed Exhibit 2.
  - Q. Have you reviewed those documents prior to testifying today?
    - A. Yes.
  - Q. Are there any changes, corrections, amendments, modifications of any kind to the Staff Audit Reports?
  - A. No, sir.
- Q. Are they true and accurate and reasonable to the best of your belief and knowledge?
- 16 A. Yes.

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- Q. You have before you what has been marked as Joint Exhibit No. 1.
- 19 A. Yes.
- Q. Can you identify that document for me, please?
- A. This is the Stipulation and
  Recommendation entered into between Staff and
  Waterville.
- Q. Were you involved in the negotiation of

this Stipulation and Recommendation?

A. Yes.

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- Q. Mr. Sarver, have you had experience working with Waterville Gas & Oil Company in the past?
- A. Yes. This is probably my 15th, 16th audit of Waterville.
  - Q. And are you acquainted with Mr. Black?
  - A. Yes, sir.
  - Q. And do you consider him to be a knowledgeable and capable individual in negotiating such agreements?
    - A. Yes, sir.
  - Q. Mr. Sarver, do you believe that there are any benefits, any public benefits to ratepayers as a result of this Stipulation?
  - A. Yes. The point of these audits is to verify the costs the companies have incurred, either through the Gas Cost Recovery Mechanism or the Uncollectible Expense Mechanism and then the associated recovery of those costs from ratepayers; and what Staff has done is examined the costs that were incurred, the revenue collected, and then recognized any difference/errors that we found in the course of our audits.

- Q. And the Stipulation and Recommendation accepts the Staff's findings, conclusions, and recommendations as contained in Staff Exhibits No. 1 and 2; is that correct?
  - A. That is correct.
- Q. Mr. Sarver, are you aware of any regulatory principle or practice that is violated by this Stipulation?
  - A. No, sir.

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- Q. This would be consistent, in your opinion, with past Stipulations entered into with Waterville Gas & Oil?
- A. Yes, it is.
- MR. MARGARD: Thank you, Your Honor. I have no further questions for Mr. Sarver.

I would respectfully move for the admission of Staff Exhibits 1 and 2, and Joint Exhibit 1; and on behalf of Waterville Gas & Oil, I respectfully move for the admission of Waterville Exhibit 1.
