ENTRY

{¶ 1} Duke Energy Ohio, Inc. (Duke) is a natural gas company as defined in R.C. 4905.03 and a public utility under R.C. 4905.02, and, as such, is subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

{¶ 2} By Entries issued on February 21, 2018, the Commission, inter alia, initiated these cases to review Duke's gas cost recovery rates, purchased gas adjustment clause, gas purchasing policies and practices, and related matters. The Entries scheduled these matters for hearing on January 15, 2019; directed that audit reports be filed no later than November 16, 2018; directed Duke to file any direct testimony at least 16 days prior to the hearing; and directed Duke to publish notice of the hearing between 15 and 30 days prior to the hearing date.

{¶ 3} On October 11, 2018, the attorney examiner granted Staff's motion to extend the hearing date and the filing date for the audit reports. Specifically, the attorney examiner extended the deadline for the filing of the audit reports to January 24, 2019, and the hearing date to March 26, 2019.

{¶ 4} On February 19, 2019, the attorney examiner rescheduled the evidentiary hearing to commence on April 2, 2019, due to scheduling conflicts.

{¶ 5} On March 8, 2019, the attorney examiner granted Duke's unopposed motion to continue the procedural schedule, with the evidentiary hearing rescheduled to begin on May 7, 2019.

{¶ 6} On April 2, 2019, the attorney examiner granted Duke's motion to call the evidentiary hearing on April 2, 2019, in order to preserve the publicized hearing notice, and then continue the hearing to May 7, 2019.

{¶ 7} Accordingly, on April 2, 2019, the evidentiary hearing was convened and continued to May 7, 2019.

{¶ 8} On April 18, 2019, Duke filed an unopposed motion to continue the procedural schedule until after June 30, 2019, in order to allow the parties to engage in settlement discussions. By Entry dated April 19, 2019, Duke's motion was granted and the evidentiary hearing was rescheduled for July 9, 2019.

{¶ 9} On June 20, 2019, Duke again filed a motion to continue the procedural schedule, along with a request for an expedited ruling. Duke proposes that the evidentiary hearing be rescheduled to reconvene on a date after July 23, 2019, in order to afford the parties additional time to finalize the terms of a settlement agreement. Duke states that the parties have been working diligently toward a resolution of the issues. Duke further states that no party objects to the motion for a continuance.

{¶ 10} The attorney examiner finds that Duke's unopposed motion is reasonable and should be granted. Accordingly, the evidentiary hearing currently scheduled for July 9, 2019, should be continued to a date to be established by future entry. Deadlines for the filing of direct testimony will also be set by future entry.

{¶ 11} It is, therefore,

{¶ 12} ORDERED, That Duke's motion for a continuance of the procedural schedule be granted. It is, further,

{¶ 13} ORDERED, That the date for the evidentiary hearing and deadlines for direct testimony be established by future entry. It is, further,

{¶ 14} ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served upon each party and interested person of record.
