I. SUMMARY

{¶ 1} The Commission grants the joint motion to dismiss the complaint with prejudice as the parties represent that all issues and claims have been resolved.

II. DISCUSSION

- {¶ 2} Pursuant to R.C. 4905.26, the Commission has authority to consider written complaints filed against a public utility by any person or corporation regarding any rate, services, regulation, or practice relating to any service furnished by the public utility that is in any respect unjust, unreasonable, insufficient, or unjustly discriminatory.
- $\{\P 3\}$ Respondent, Ohio Edison Company (Ohio Edison or Company), is a public utility as defined in R.C. 4905.02 and, as such, is subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.
- {¶ 4} On February 4, 2019, Jed Johnson (Complainant) filed a complaint against Ohio Edison. The complaint alleges that certain items of his personal property were destroyed when an Ohio Edison service technician came to his house to fix a problem Complainant was experiencing with power flickering.

{¶ 5} On February 25, 2019, Ohio Edison filed its answer to the complaint. In its answer, Ohio Edison admits some of the complaint's allegations, denies others, denies still others for lack of sufficient information to form a belief as to their truth, and sets forth several affirmative defenses.

- $\{\P 6\}$ A settlement conference was scheduled for and held on May 16, 2019. On and after that date the parties engaged in settlement discussions.
- {¶ 7} On June 10, 2019, Complainants and Respondent filed a joint motion to dismiss. In the motion, the parties advise the Commission that they have resolved all issues and claims arising in connection with the matters set forth in this proceeding. Accordingly, the parties jointly request that this complaint be dismissed with prejudice as a settled case.
- $\{\P 8\}$ In view of the settlement of the complaint, the Commission finds that this matter should be dismissed with prejudice and closed of record.

III. ORDER

- $\{\P 9\}$ It is, therefore,
- {¶ 10} ORDERED, That the joint motion to dismiss be granted and that Case No. 19-372-EL-CSS be dismissed with prejudice and closed of record. It is, further,
 - **{¶ 11}** ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served upon each party of record.
