On April 3, 2017, the State of Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission cancelled Atlas Commodities, LLC's ("Atlas") Electric Generation Supplier License as a broker/marketer due to missing proof of financial security. Although Atlas had timely obtained a continuation certificate of the required bond, the certificate itself was never received by the Commission. A copy of the relevant continuation certificate is attached as Exhibit B-5. Atlas' bonding company sent the certificate to the Commission by first-class mail, and Atlas believes the certificate was lost in the mail. Because Atlas was already in the process of shifting its retail energy operations to a new affiliate, Atlas Commodities II Retail Energy, LLC, Atlas decided in consultation with the Commission to submit a new license application under the affiliate's name. Atlas Commodities II Retail Energy, LLC's license application was approved by the Commission on January 18, 2018.
