Archer Energy is actively licensed by the applicable state authorities to provide retail natural gas service in the following states: Ohio, Indiana, Wyoming, and Nebraska. From 2015 thru 2017 Archer was licensed in Illinois but voluntarily withdrew and exited in good standing with the state of Illinois.

Archer Energy is registered and actively providing retail natural gas service to customers in the following market areas: Northern Indiana Public Service Co (NIPSCO), Vectren Indiana, Columbia Gas of Ohio, Citizens Energy, and Black Hills Energy. From 2015 thru 2017 Archer was registered and actively serving customers behind Peoples Gas, but voluntarily withdrew and exited in good standing. Archer also has registration pending with Dominion East Ohio.

While it is our first choice to utilize UCB, Archer Energy can easily move to a direct billing platform where UCB is unavailable or circumstances necessity invoicing customers directly. Archer Energy already operates in a market area where it is responsible for providing a bill directly to customers in a timely manner. In either case, UCB or an internally created bill provided to customers, Archer Energy's charges are provided in a clear and concise manner along with our toll-free phone number such that customers may easily reach us to discuss their bill or any issues they may have with their natural gas supply service.

In the event of a customer dispute, Archer Energy has dispute resolution procedures in place, maintained by Mr. Andrew Ernst, CPA. Mr. Ernst created the policies and procedures for the call center, customer complaint resolution, and also managed utility and commission complaints for his former employer, Border Energy, Inc. serving the needs of nearly 100,000 residential gas and electricity customers.

Highlights of the Archer Energy's dispute resolution procedures include:

- Archer will use its best efforts to resolve the dispute in the most efficient and timely manner possible.
- Archer will acknowledge all written complaints either in writing or by personal contact.
- Archer will maintain a detailed record of each complaint, the results of the investigation, and the final disposition of the complaint.







Our commodity risk management strategy is to hedge substantially all of our forecasted demand for our customers selecting a fixed price product at the time of execution, based on normalized consumption patterns, adjusted for forecasted weather deviations and anticipated attrition. Our management team has significant experience executing on this strategy even in the most difficult of operating environments.

To execute this strategy, Archer Energy works with industry leading supply partners for the purchase of natural gas for retail sales. Archer Energy already physically transports natural gas on interstate pipelines to local distribution companies (LDC's) required delivery points/gates, and schedules deliveries on LDC systems for thousands of retail choice customers in three different regions of the country. Archer Energy relies on its deep technical experience, nominating and transporting gas on over 20 different interstate pipelines and coordinating purchase and delivery efforts relying solely on proprietary internally created systems; Archer Energy does not have the need at this time to involve or rely on a third party provider to meet the demands of its retail natural gas customers. Where possible, Archer Energy relies on delivery requirements provided by LDC's to meet the demands of its retail customers. Where LDC's do not provide delivery requirements for Archer Energy, Archer Energy relies again on its deep experience to develop proprietary delivery modeling algorithms that take into account a variety of factors such as temperature, wind, seasonality, customer mix, and other market dynamics to closely match supply with retail customer demand.
