As Governor DeWine stated and the Sandusky Register reported on April 24, 2020, "The bald eagle is a symbol of American strength and resilience. The eagle's comeback in Ohio and across the country proves that we can overcome any challenge when we work together." And we need to accept the challenge to do everything possible to save our nation's bald eagles.

The Sandusky Register reported that Erie County ranks THIRD and Seneca County FIFTH in the State of Ohio for bald eagle nests, thereby making both Erie and Seneca counties NOT suitable locations to build wind turbines of any size. Bald eagles need 2.5 miles to protect their migratory nesting patterns.

Just as eagles need protecting, so do the humans that require 3,250 feet of safety (buffer zones) from the wind turbines. Do not allow wind turbines in the Northern Ohio. Thank you for reading my comments.
