I write to you today to ask you to approve the Revised Joint Stipulation and Recommendation signed by Icebreaker, the Ohio Environmental Council, Sierra Club, the Business Network for Offshore Wind, and the Indiana/Kentucky/Ohio Regional Council of Carpenters in the Icebreaker Windpower, Inc. case before the Ohio Power Siting Board. Project Icebreaker provides a new solution to ensuring cleaner generation comes right from our backyard in Ohio.

This innovative project will help Ohio reduce our heavy reliance on fossil fuels.
