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Against Wind turbines in Lake Erie My family and I oppose wind turbines in Lake Erie. My family and I , along with many others including boating, environmental and conservations groups, are not opposed to clean energy. We all boat, fish and swim in Lake Erie all summer long. Lake Erie is where we spend our recreational time, money and family experiences. However, a critical concern about Icebreaker, and the hundreds to thousand more turbines that could follow, is the unknown impact on the lake which is, first and foremost, the source of drinking water for 12 million people. For example, there are unknown problems stemming from turbine installation and laying miles of underwater transmission cables that will stir up decades of carcinogens and heavy metals accumulated on the lake bottom from a century of dumping dredged materials off Cleveland. The issue also affects other Great Lakes where there is a push to start industrial wind farms on the Great Lakes in other states. Be aware, because fires and explosions often occur in wind turbines, each one would pour the 440 gallons of oils and chemicals inside each turbine into the lake waters. Then there could be carcasses washing up on area beaches from thousands of birds that turbine blades are known to kill. Lake Erie is a recognized migratory bird flyway. And, there are many more unanswered environmental, economic and aesthetic questions. As of this date, the Icebreaker developers have only submitted an environmental opinion from a paid consultant hired to support their permit application. Given that we are looking at a proposed generational change to Ohio's greatest natural resource which experts still consider a "fragile lake," the need for a full EIS is a no brainer. Our Canadian friends say don't allow wind turbines They point to their personal experiences and say, stop the insanity. It is notable that in 2011, Ontario, Canada, imposed a Great Lakes moratorium on turbines for many of the same concerns about the impact of wind turbines. The moratorium is still in effect today because of the inability to adequately address or mitigate similar environmental concerns, particularly with respect to drinking water quality.
