ALJ SCHABO: Good evening and welcome, everyone. My name is Patricia Schabo, and with me is Matthew Sandor. We are the Administrative Law Judges in the Legal Department of the Ohio Power Siting Board. I have been assigned by the Board to this proceeding which is Case No. 19-1823-EL-BGN.

One of our duties as the assigned

Administrative Law Judges is conducting a public
hearing in this case which involves the application
filed by Big Plain Solar, LLC, for a Certificate to
Construct a Solar-Powered Gen -- Electric Generation
Facility in Madison County, Ohio.

Due to the COVID-19 emergency that remains in affect under Executive Order No. 2020-01D issued by the Governor of Ohio in March 2020, today's hearing is being held through Webex which enables interested persons to offer testimony on the proposed project by telephone or via -- or video via the internet. The hearing is also being live streamed at www.youtube.com/user/pucohio.

Before we get started with the public hearing, I would like to address some preliminary

issues. First, if you experience technical difficulties during the hearing, there are several options to address the issue. Are there any questions before we officially get started with today's proceeding?

Okay. If not, we will begin with the formal proceeding. Judge Sandor.

ALJ SANDOR: Thank you. The Ohio Power Siting Board has scheduled for hearing at this time and place Case No. 19-1823-EL-BGN which is captioned in the Matter of the Application of Big Plain Solar, LLC, for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need to Construct a Solar-Powered Electric Generation Facility in Madison County, Ohio.

As mentioned earlier, my name is Matt Sandor, and with me is Patricia Schabo. We are Administrative Law Judges in the Board's Legal Department, and we will be conducting today's hearing.

In addition to Administrative Law Judge
Schabo and myself, there are other staff members from
the Board assisting with various aspects of the
hearing including Micah Schmidt, Mary Fischer, Jill
Coker, Matt Butler, Anna Perry, and Aubrey Barker who
will be overseeing the event on Webex and YouTube.

At this time we'll take the appearances by the counsel of the parties of this case. We will begin with the Applicant.

MR. SETTINERI: Yes, good evening, your Honors. On behalf of Big Plain Solar, LLC, Mike Settineri with the law firm of Vorys, Sater, Seymour and Pease, LLP, 52 East Gay Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215. Thank you.

ALJ SANDOR: Thank you. We have two
Intervenors in this case. First, the Ohio Farm
Bureau Federation. Hearing none. And Thomas A.
Coughlin and TDC Farms, LLC. Hearing none. And
Board Staff. Hearing none as well. I'll note that
while counsel for Ohio Farm Bureau Federation, Thomas
A. Coughlin and TDC Farms, LLC, and Board Staff may
not be participating in this proceeding, non-counsel
representatives of these entities may be attending.

The subject of today's hearing is an application filed by Big Plain Solar, LLC, for the purpose of constructing and operating the solar-powered electric generation facility.

Specifically the proposed project would occupy approximately 1,200 acres within a 2,438 acre project area in Fairfield and Oak Run Townships in Madison County. The project will generate 196 megawatts.

Big Plain Solar's application was filed on April 27, 2020, and was supplemented on May 28 and June 22, 2020. I would also note that the Board's

Staff filed a Report of Investigation on December 22, 2020. This report is a recommendation from -- from the Board's Staff and does not necessarily reflect what the Board's final determination in this case will be.

2.1

The purpose of today's public hearing is to receive testimony regarding Big Plain Solar's application from entities and persons in the local community who are affected by the proposed project but who are not parties to the case.

The public -- the public hearing is not a question and answer session but is an opportunity to let the Board know what you think about the proposed project. Today's public hearing is only one aspect of the process in this case. An evidentiary hearing is scheduled to begin on Tuesday, January 19, 2021, through Webex. The purpose of the evidentiary hearing is for the parties in this case, including the Applicant, the Intervenors, and Board Staff to provide testimony and other evidence regarding the project.

Tonight's hearing is being transcribed by a court reporter, Karen Gibson from Armstrong & Okey. If you plan to testify, please speak clearly so that the court reporter can accurately reflect your

comments on the record. Please make sure that you verbally respond to all questions asked in order that they can be properly transcribed.

2.1

After I finish with this introduction, I will begin by calling individuals on the registration list to testify about the proposed project. Each person who registered to testify will be permitted to speak once about the project. We will ask you to take an oath or affirmation that what you are about to say is the truth. Your testimony will then be considered as part of the official record in this case, and it will be reviewed by the Board before a final decision is made on the application.

Additionally, counsel for the parties in this case as well as Judge Schabo and myself will be permitted to ask you questions about your testimony. Should you decide that you do not want to testify when I call your name from the registration list, you can pass to the next witness. Also once you have finished testifying or if you are here merely to observe, you may leave the hearing at any time that you wish.

14 years we have had to -- the tax burden has been borne

by the homeowners and farmers of Fairfield and Oak

16 Run Township. We have no industry.

And one positive note about this project

18 it will provide additional funding for the Madison

19 Plains School District. Madison Plains is one of the

20 largest rural school districts in the state of Ohio.

21 They have a unique -- a very high transportation

22 expense due to all their students have to be

23 transported by bus, some of them over 20 miles to the

24 school facility. Also we know the demands of

25 education and the extra burden of the COVID outbreak.

I think the future is in renewable energy as the United States moves away from the internal combustion engine for personal transportation, moving more towards electric vehicles that require electricity. We've generated much of our electricity in the past using fossil fuels, and we have evidence that those fuels do damage our environment.

So solar energy is quiet. It's -- does not damage the environment. And once the project is finished, the land can be returned easily to agricultural production.

This project will provide income for the schools, jobs, permanent help -- permanent jobs in the project, and my conclusion is the project will benefit the people of Madison County and the state of Ohio and the environment within our areas.

MR. SETTINERI: No, your Honor. Thank you.

ALJ SANDOR: No. Thank you, Mr. Andrix. Good night. Have a good evening.

23 | Madison County Board of County Commissioners, we are

24 very -- very excited about this project and

25 | 100 percent supportive of this project. We feel the

economic impact of the local government in the area will be significant, and the impact of the local school district, Madison Plains Local School

District, is very significant. They are a school district that has extremely limited opportunities for any additional revenue. It's mostly agricultural area. So other than a levy which further financially burdens the property owners there, this is one of the few opportunities that they would have to -- to boost that revenue.

So with that said, I will keep it short and sweet; but, again, as the local government here, fully supportive of the project, and we hope it moves forward with due haste. Thank you.

Approval of this project will be beneficial to the residents of Ohio in many ways, 3 jobs for local residents, increase in tax revenue to 5 local schools and municipalities, increase in 6 pollution created from other sources of power 7 generation, availability of clean energy for business in Ohio, the availability of clean energy for the 8 9 residents of Ohio, and diversity of energy generation 10 in Ohio. For many IBEW men and women in rural Ohio such as myself, we made great careers and started our careers in projects like this one. The IBEW, we pride ourselves in our highly trained and skilled workers and take pride in our work, and we want to get the job done right. So, of course, we are going to be in support of this project.

So I want the project to not only create these 450 jobs, I also want it to create 450

MS. TOOPS: Yes.

ALJ SCHABO: Okay. Thank you very much. Please proceed with your testimony.

MS. TOOPS: This story is a gas. My husband and I saved for years to buy our dream home. We lived in Hilliard in a crowded community in the suburbs. After I finished college at Ohio State and moved on to a life in a close-knit community of Hilliard, which we found rewarding and nice, but having grown up on a strawberry farm and knowing what it feels like to grow your own food and to enjoy the open space, I knew that suburban life was going to be short lived for us.

We saved, we searched, and we found our dream home in July of 2020 on Big Plain Circleville Road. The rolling hills of Madison County are famous. Soybeans, corn, picturesque backgrounds, beautiful sunshine, beautiful sunsets, you just look forward to life out here. That's what we were so eager and anxious to be a part of.

Now, the plot we purchased is next to farmland that has grown corn and soybeans for decades. We were so excited. We found out on moving day that this project was planned. I was holding

moving boxes when I was getting the information that these rolling hills were about to be filled with space-age solar panels and a bunch of information I didn't understand, but I was -- I was immediately upset, alarmed, overwhelmed, and I wanted to puke. I am sure everyone on this call and everyone who is tuned in has had some kind of news like this where your stomach drops, start sweating. You are just overwhelmed. It took a couple weeks for me to process the emotion.

And what really makes my position in this unique is that I work in the -- in the energy industry. Specifically I work in long-term agreements that impact people, property, and the long-term success of small communities like London, like Madison Plains, and I truly understand the impacts, short-term and long-term, that these deals come with.

I understand firsthand that big projects with big companies bring big dollars and big opportunity. For a small community like this, it's important that everyone understands that the partner you choose in projects like these culturally fits in the community, that our goals are aligned. We want the same thing.

Sometimes in the -- the initial stages of a deal like this, we'll get excited about what it means to jobs and what it means to schools. And you don't really think beyond that. But in my role in my professional career, my job is to explore what those opportunities are and how they deliver value. So I know firsthand what a good project plan looks like and a good partner to the community and one that's just here to do a job.

Now, the thoughts and opinion that I am sharing this evening are my own and not reflective of the industry I work for or the company I work for, but I just want to add that. But since my initial shock and grief, I have had a lot of conversations with the First Solar project representatives. The first one was hysterical, sobbing, anger, expletives, going through the process of emotion with project partners that didn't foresee a home sale and didn't foresee me coming knowing what I do in the industry I work in.

Through the conversations I've had, they have offered support. They've been great listeners. They've been helpful. They've been kind, and they -- most importantly when I needed it, they recognized how unfair and how -- how this disappointment would

impact me and my family given that we didn't see this coming.

Now, I know jobs related to these projects come and go. I know that the impacts to schools come and go. But I know that these opportunities that come from partnerships like these have lasting impacts on the students in the schools, on the farmers who have tried to overcome either years of disappointment in the weather or, you know, whatever range of challenges they face.

And I can testify in my opinion that

First Solar recognizes their responsibilities to the impacted neighbors, to the schools long term, and translating dollars that go into the school system and to real opportunity, education, ensure that these students have an opportunity that would not otherwise exist had it not been for this project. They are prepared to be a trusted partner and take their place in this county, and I look forward to being that old crotchety neighbor and making sure that they hold their promises.

Now, I'm never going to do cartwheels that there are going to be solar panels in my yard, and I remain disappointed at this hand that I have been dealt, but through this process through the last

several months, I've recognized the true character of the -- of the project managers, of the company that will be responsible for this long-term investment; and I can tell you that they are genuine, they are transparent, they are here to be a long-term partner for us in this community.

And I think it helps to have a nagging little person like myself on their shoulder pushing them to be the best partner they can be until, you know, the project is complete. So again, not ever going to do cartwheels but knowing that we have a good, genuine steward at the helm of this project, I can sleep at night. Thank you.
