Both men who admitted trafficking

Both men who admitted trafficking fentany) out of a room at Downtown's Millennium Hotel have been sentenced. On Wednesday, Hamilton County Common Pleas Judge Chris Wagner sentenced Keyonta Hicks, 31, to four years in prison, a term that had been agreed upon as part of his guilty plea. Late last month, a man related to Hicks, 28-year-old Keron Hicks, also was sentenced to an agreed-upon four

was sentenced to an agreed-upon four years in prison

During a November 2019 raid of their hotel room, police found more than 360 grams of fentanyl, officials said. The drug had been prepared for sale, court

documents say. Police also found items including digital scales, a duffel bag with about \$2,700 in cash and "a large amount of jewelry," the documents say.

The street value of the fentanyl found in the hotel room was estimated to be more than \$500,000. An extremely mall mount of the synthetic opioid can be lethal. Keron and Keyonta Hicks pleaded

guilty in September to drug trafficking charges. Court documents list the same East Price Hill address for both.

her own car. He is charged with feloni-ous assault and abduction. The documents state Flagg and the victim were in the parking lot of a West-

"(Flagg) appears to punch the victim, causing her to fall down onto the pavement and then she stops moving," police said after review-ing some surveillance footage. "(Flagg) then dragged the victim to the side of

neighbor banging on her door, alerting her to the fire. Documents say the wom-an found flames coming from the bath-room curtain into her home. The bath-room was next to the children's room.

Police said the woman and children Police said the woman and children were able to safely get out the back door. The woman described a history of domestic violence between herself and Murphy, police said. She told police Murphy had sent "unusual" messages the subth before

the night before. Murphy was located at the Ranch Inn on Tytus Avenue and taken into custo-dy. Murphy told police he started a fire under the car in the attached garage of the Middletown home, which eventual-

ly caught the house on fire.

dery stimulant Jan. I when their drug-sniffing dog named Bruno alerted to the press in a shipment of handicrafts bound for a home in Houston, customs officials said in a news release. The release said the press and the methamphetamine inside it together

weighed 25 pounds. The release said overdose deaths from methamphetamine and cocaine have been increasing at an alarming pace since 2009. Provisional data by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention said 2020 overdose death

rates from stimulants have increased by 18% over 2019, the release said.

Ohio. The relocation equipment includes seven self-supporting engineered steel poles, along with approximately 1.14 miles (6,000 feet) of new conductor. The project also includes work on steel lattice towers to the cast of the Morgan Substation. This work will improve electric service reliability by providing an additional option for routing power in the event that other transmission lines are damaged or require routine mainte-nance.
