While building and erecting these monstrous structures, exactly what has been recommended to ensure
the stability of the ground supporting them ??

Lyme Township mainly sits on bedrock. Bedrock that in many places is within 3 to 4 feet under the top soil.

I am particularly interested in this as I discovered this while digging the basement for my homes foundation.

It was great to see how the bedrock reacted to the simple force of the backhoe shovel as it applied force to
the rock to remove it. It splintered and broke and cracked everywhere. But I am sure you will be applying much
more force and pressure then I did.

How far will you be extending the support structure into the ground ? Will you be drilling ? Be blasting ?

What means will you be using to ensure you can reach a deep enough depth to support these huge structures ?

As I am concerned as to the vibrations and cracks these methods can produce and how they will affect my property
and my home. Not only right now, but with future time.

Will the continual motion or vibration of these monsters also cause any disruption in the bed rock structure ? Causing any
unseen cracks to travel as they react to the environment ? And lets not forget, we do have the occasional high winds
and tornados that may cause extra tension on the structures grounding system, as well causing cracks to travel.

I for one am not willing to take the chance of the damage one of these may cause to my home, my family, future
families or wildlife that may reside here.

I do not want these structures in my neighborhood !
