Smart Columbus Energy LLC (SCE) was formed in 2020 to provide clean energy solutions to companies in the Central Ohio region through electricity aggregation. Smart Columbus utilizes its industry partnerships and membership to scale buying power to offer cost effective clean energy for participating customers.

SCE is a non-profit LLC with a team of directors and advisers that are made up of experts in corporate sustainability, energy procurement and electricity supply generation. SCE's team has years or experience in creating successful corporate sustainability campaigns and project management, delivering high value return to its clients.

In June 2020, SCE was certified pursuant to Certificate Number 20-1479E (1) in Case No. 20-920-EL-AGG as a competitive retail electric service provider to provide aggregation and power broker services within the state of Ohio. Smart Columbus Energy LLC is seeking re-authorization to provide retail aggregation and power broker services within Ohio. It has no other licenses or authorizations in other jurisdictions.

Exhibit B-2 "Experience & Plans"

Smart Columbus Energy (SCE) has two years of experience providing brokering services to corporate clients. During the term of its original certification, SCE brokered transactions with three large corporate clients, with contracts that annually consume approximately 62,000 MWh. Also, to date, there have been no customer complaints.

Associates, partners and advisers of Smart Columbus Energy (SCE) have decades of experience in contracting with customers across different industries, including electricity. SCE builds strong relationships between energy suppliers and their customers and will advocate and assure customers receive the best value for their needs.

SCE leverages its ability to build large coalitions to scale buying power to ultimately create high value, competitively priced, clean energy for its customers. Without the ability to scale buying power, clean energy is not financially feasible for many companies and organizations. With SCE, customers are able to access pricing for clean energy from Ohio assets they otherwise would not receive on their own. SCE also provides a simple, turn-key solution for companies to purchase electricity from assets in Ohio and in turn, meet many of their carbon reporting and environmental, social, and governance goals, without the high transaction costs associated with procuring clean power directly from project developers.

SCE will offer advisory services in regard to clean energy procurement to customers. SCE will provide guidance to customers on any incentives or disincentives from a financial or regulatory perspective.

SCE's team has a longstanding history or working through complex issues with corporate partners, and is prepared to solve any issues, however unlikely, that occur.

The applicant will only provide direct aggregation or broker services to mercantile commercial and industrial customers. The applicant will not aggregate residential of small commercial customers, nor will the applicant provide direct broker services to these customers.

The applicant solicits mercantile commercial and industrial customers through direct solicitation with those customers' leadership and energy management teams. The applicant's solicitation strategy focuses on the applicant's existing relationships with mercantile commercial and industrial customers who are part of The Columbus Partnership, which is the applicant's parent.

Each mercantile commercial and industrial customer receiving services from the applicant has direct contact information, including telephone and email, for the applicant's principal director. Further, the primary customers served by the applicant are typically members of The Columbus Partnership, the applicant's parent company.

Responding to inquiries and complaints is dependent on the nature of the inquiry. All types of calls are accepted by The Columbus Partnership on behalf of the applicant (614-225-0500; https://columbuspartnership.com/). addition. Mark In Patton (mp@columbuspartnership.com), Vice President of New Ventures and principal director of the applicant is the primary contact for responding customer inquiries and complaints applicant's energy services. In addition, Zach (zm@columbuspartnership.com), Director of Clean Energy Initiatives and an employee of The Columbus Partnership, will be available to respond to inquiries and complaints. Calls concerning billing, technical issues, or electric service are directed to competitive retail generation provider or electric distribution utility.

The applicant developed relationships with multiple trusted retail generation suppliers providing services to mercantile commercial or industrial customers with whom the applicant has provided aggregation or broker services. Each supplier is vetted by the applicant on the basis of the supplier's service record and clean energy products, with the particular ability to source clean energy from projects in Ohio and PJM at a competitive price. To this end, the applicant has already entered into negotiations with established suppliers, certified by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio, and with excellent service records.
