Below is a high level view of the planned process for crediting the 2,091 accounts previously billed in excess of 12 months. Please let me know if additional information is needed.

Back Billing Project – 2,091 Accounts to Receive Credits

- Project will commence Tuesday, June 15, 2004 (Cycle 12). We will process the adjustments by cycle until all accounts have been adjusted.
- 3 Full Time Equivalent employees will be assigned to the project to insure credits are issued to customers in a timely manner.
- The Specialists will work from the 2,091 customer spreadsheet approved by Management and PUCO and utilize the crediting methodology approved by PUCO.
- The approved "notification letter" will be mailed to customers prior to their cycle billing.
- The credit adjustment will appear as a line item on their next bill received.
- To assist with customer inquiries, a copy of the "notification letter" will be provided to the Contact Center for reference and accounts will be noted to explain the credit. This special credit may be further identified by the use of "EEST" (exceeds allowable number of estimates) as the reason code on the ledger screen.
- PUCO will be notified once all customers on the approved spreadsheet have been credited.

We will process the credits by cycle until all accounts are adjusted. The three Specialists are committed full time to working the 2,091 accounts. Assuming there are no unforeseen opportunities that hamper our progress, the estimated time to complete the project is the end of July, 2004. We will explore the possibility of providing a progress report every two weeks.

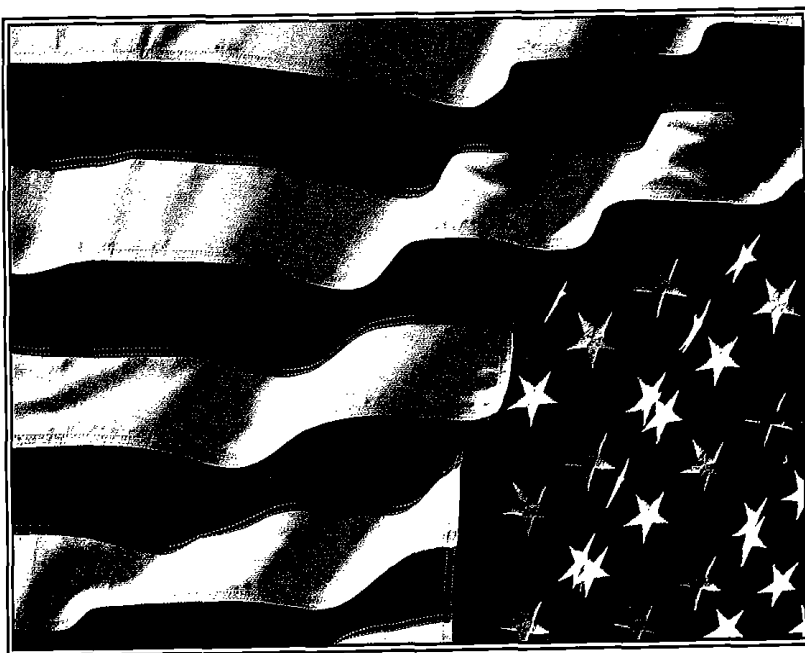
