## **LEGAL NOTICE**

Notice is given that in Case No. 96-1027-TP-CSS, The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio issued, on April 17, 1997, an Opinion and Order as clarified in an Entry on Rehearing issued June 5, 1997, determining among other things, that Ameritech Ohio (Ameritech) engaged in inadequate and discriminatory treatment to the detriment of the Ohio Cable Telecommunications Association, Coaxial Communications, Inc., V Cable, Inc., and Time Warner Cable and to the benefit of its affiliate, New Media. Specifically, the Commission found that Ameritech provided inadequate service in not adequately notifying complainants regarding the change in its pole attachment policies and not insuring that its tariff reflected its most current policies. Having made a finding of service inadequacy, the Commission will now proceed to make a determination, pursuant to Section 4905.46, Revised Code, whether the declaration of dividends by Ameritech will postpone compliance with any Commission order or affect the adequacy of service rendered or to be rendered by Ameritech. Any interested person, firm, corporation, or entity who can show good cause why the declaration of dividends will postpone compliance or affect the adequacy of service should file with the Commission a written statement detailing the reasons on or before June 23, 1997. Unless the Commission receives such a written statement and an accompanying request for oral hearing in this matter, the issue will be decided on the basis of the information submitted and attested to by Ameritech in Case No. 96-1027-TP-CSS.
