Gentlemen:

The Co-Operative Legislative Committee representing Ohio railroad employees wishes to file a weed and vegetation complaint (Ohio Administrative Code 4901-5-22) against the Consolidated Rail Corporation (Conrail), which railroad is subject to regulation under Chapters 4905 and 4907 of the Revised Code.

In conducting its railroad operation on the Randall Secondary, Cleveland, Ohio, said company has permitted unsafe and hazardous conditions to arise due to the excessive growth of weeds and vegetation on its property at the following location:

For the entire length of the lead on the Randall Secondary, from East 79th Street to the Cleveland Track Material, trees need to be trimmed. These trees are rubbing the sides of cars and engines.

By its failure to establish or maintain an adequate vegetation control program early in the season, it is now endangering the railroad employees required to use this area in the performance of their required duties.

It is requested that an investigation be conducted, under Section 4907.08, to determine if this railroad at the above

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location is in violation of your Commission's "Weed Order". If excessive growth is found, then an appropriate and timely order should be issued to require the elimination of the growth and the establishment of a vegetation control program to prevent the recurrence of such unsafe conditions.
