Dear Attorney Examiner Stoneking:

On May 6, 2004, the MCI companies (MCImetro Access Transmission Services, LLC and MCI WorldCom, Inc.) filed a Notice of Discharge and Motion for Dismissal Without Prejudice in this proceeding. The purpose of the Notice and Motion to Dismiss was to advise the Commission that MCI's Second Amended Plan of Reorganization had been approved by the bankruptcy court, and that according to the plan, any party asserting a claim against MCI prior to the bankruptcy filing must now pursue such claim with the bankruptcy court. Accordingly, the Commission no longer has jurisdiction to adjudicate claims against MCI that were asserted in this complaint.

To the extent that the complaint in this proceeding raises issues involving improper billing or collection activities by MCI, please be advised that MCI has written off all amounts due on the complainant's account and collection activities have ceased.

There are no remaining issues over which the Commission has jurisdiction, and the complaint should be dismissed forthwith in accordance with MCI's Notice of Discharge.
