APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL OF THE UNIVERSAL SERVICE FUND RIDER AND THE ENERGY EFFICIENCY REVOLVING LOAN FUND RIDER AS PROPOSED BY THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENT FOR THE COLUMBUS SOUTHERN POWER COMPANY AND THE OHIO POWER COMPANY

Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Sections 4928.52 and 4928.62, the Ohio Department of Development ("ODOD") is hereby filing the attached Universal Service Fund rider and the Energy Efficiency Revolving Loan Fund rider. These riders were required to be effective on July 1, 2000, however, due to delays in the transfer of this program, ODOD requests that the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio makes the rider effective on customer bills rendered on or after September 1, 2000.
