Appellants Columbus Southern Power Company and Ohio Power Company (hereinafter referred to collectively as "appellants" or "Companies") hereby give notice of their appeal, pursuant to R. C. 4903.11 and 4903.13, to the Supreme Court of Ohio, from an Opinion and Order of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("Commission"), entered on September 28, 2000, and the Commission's Entry on Rehearing entered on November 21, 2000, in PUCO Case Nos. 99-1729-EL-ETP and 99-1730-EL-ETP.

Appellants were and are parties of record in PUCO Case Nos. 99-1729-EL-ETP and 99-1730-EL-ETP, and timely filed their Application for Rehearing of the appellee's September 28, 2000 Opinion and Order in accordance with R.C. 4903.10. Appellants' Application for Rehearing was denied, with respect to the issues on appeal herein, by the Commission's November 21, 2000 Entry on Rehearing.

The appellants complain and allege that appellee's September 28, 2000 Opinion and Order, and appellee's November 21, 2000 Entry on Rehearing in PUCO Case Nos.

99-1729-EL-ETP and 99-1730-EL-ETP are unlawful, unjust and unreasonable in the following respects, as set forth in appellants' Application for Rehearing:

- 1. The Commission erred by concluding that the Companies' proposed public utility excise tax credit rider should become effective April 30, 2001, instead of April 30, 2002.
- 2. The Commission erred by concluding that the issue concerning the public utilities excise tax credit rider proposed by the Companies "is purely one of fact." (Opinion and Order, page 44.)
- 3. The Commission erred by concluding that the Staff's position is more reasonable than the Companies' position regarding the effective date of the public utilities excise tax credit rider. (Id.)
- 4. The Commission erred by concluding that the issue concerning the public utilities excise tax credit rider proposed by the Companies is "when does liability of the companies' ratepayers for the public utility excise tax end." (Id.)
- 5. The Commission erred by concluding that the companies ratepayers are liable for the public utility excise tax. (Id.)
- 6. The Commission erred by concluding that "the companies' customers pay in the measurement year amounts representing the companies (sic) public utilities tax obligation in the subsequent privilege year." (<u>Id</u>.)

WHEREFORE, appellants respectfully submit that the appellee's September 28, 2000 Opinion and Order and appellee's November 21, 2000 Entry on Rehearing in PUCO Case Nos. 99-1729-EL-ETP and 99-1730-EL-ETP are unlawful, unjust and unreasonable, with respect to the issues on appeal herein, and should be reversed.
