Hi there, Carolyn: So how do you help a kid navigate getting cut, as a senior, from a club sports team he's been on for 10 years? He's shy, and this was basically his only social venue as well.

Obviously, this is a first-world problem, but we're trying to help him deal with the unpleasant feelings appropriately and figure out ways to find a new activity - balancing his newness with the fact that he'll be one of the older kids. Thanks.

Cut: I was just talking with friends about how high school is when most sports careers end, like it or not - usually a hard "not" - and how that can rat-

tle kids who've invested years of hard work in these dreams.

One friend had far and away the best response to set the tone and nudge a kid forward: "I'm so proud of you."

Followed by how you watched him work so hard for himself and the team, and you hope he feels good about doing everything he could to get there. Even though he fell short, giving it all he had means there's nothing to regret.

He might not be ready to hear this yet – this is more a listening time than a talking one for parents - but he wasn't cut from what his sport taught him about himself, about hard work, about losing as an inevitable part of life and about working around his shyness to be part of a team.

As for "ways to find a new activity"how long has he had to process getting cut? You say he's shy, but I don't want to connect that automatically with other emotional fallout. See how he fares before you jump in to help.

By the way, almost all sports stories end with getting cut, riding the bench, finishing the season out of the playoffs or getting eliminated in them, etc. Big pyramid, small tip. Part of the deal.

**Readers' thoughts:** 

• A lot of colleges have intramural sports. And my city has sports leagues for adults who liked the sport but weren't good enough for the next level, or just want to have fun.

• This may be a "love it or hate it" suggestion, but when I was cut, I became one of the team managers. I still got to hang out with my friends and feel like I contributed to the team.

• A senior is old enough to get into coaching or refereeing younger kids. It's fun and very rewarding when any kid gets better because of something I said.

• Maybe some down time for the next few months before graduation would be welcome.

# **Netflix indefinitely postpones Princess Diana documentary**

Netflix has indefinitely postponed a documentary about Princess Diana's famous 1995 BBC interview following news of Prince Philip's death Friday.

"Diana: The Interview that Shocked the World" was scheduled to premiere Sunday, but has been pushed back to an undisclosed date, Netflix confirmed. The interview was released last year in several countries, but Netflix licensed it for streaming in the U.S., U.K. and Canada starting Sunday.

# **NOTICE OF** PROPOSED MAJOR TILITY FACILITY

Duke Energy Ohio, Inc. (Duke Energy Ohio) proposes to expand the existing 138kV Greendale Substation by approximately 300 square feet (approximately 21 percent) to install approximately 50 feet of new fencing around a secondary oil containment berm. The substation expansion will expand the existing 138-kV Greendale Substation to improve onsite oil containment from potential underground transmission tystems and add flood protection within the substation.

The Greendale Substation Expansion Project is part of a mitigation plan to lower the overall risk of underground transmission systems. The design for this Project will allow for full containment of oil in the transmission line (18,475 gallons) plus added flood protection at this substation to mitigate up to 4.5 inches of rainfall. The work requires the expansion of the Greendale Substation site/fence approximately 12 feet north of the existing northern fence line on existing Duke Energy Ohio property. Approximately 150 feet of a 4-foot tall Strongwell brand wall containment system will be installed within the extended fence to contain the entire volume of oil in the circuit (~20,000 gallons). Approximately 60 feet of 6-inch perforated pipe, for a French drain, will be installed inside the western and northern sides of the oil containment area. This scope will be completed within the existing Duke Energy Ohio Greendale Substation property.

Duke Energy Ohio has filed a Letter of Notification with the Ohio Power Siting Board (Board), under Case No. 21-229-EL-BLN. This number should be included in all communications with respect to the Project. The Letter of Notification to construct, operate, and maintain this facility is now pending before the Board. Comments and/or petitions to intervene will be accepted by the Board up to 10 days following the publication date of this notice, pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code Rules 4906-2-12 and 4906-6-08. Petitions or comments should be addressed to Ohio Power Siting Board, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio, 43215, and must reference Case No. 21-229-EL-BLN.

A map of the project area is included below. Construction will begin in August of 2021, pending approval of this Letter of Notification.
