# **Exhibit C-2 Statement Explaining the Reason for the Proposal**

Duke Energy Ohio proposes to modify the rate design from a percentage of distribution charge to a fixed monthly customer charge to Rider PF. Rider PF recovers the capital and O&M costs of programs, modifications, and offerings related to the continued evolution of the distribution grid and enhanced customer experience, including programs, modifications, and offerings that may be engendered by the Commission's PowerForward review incremental to amounts recovered in other riders or in base rates. The proposed modification is being implemented in accordance with the Commission's November 17, 2021, Finding and Order in Case No. 20-666-EL-RDR, which authorized Duke Energy Ohio to recover costs associated with the first 12 months of work on data access projects completed in compliance with the Stipulation and Recommendation approved in consolidated cases 17-32-EL-AIR, *et al.* and costs associated with a distribution working group. The Stipulation and Recommendation filed on August 18, 2021, and approved by the November 17, 2021, Finding and Order in Case No. 20-666-EL-RDR provides, among other things:

- b. For the Rider PF "Component Two" investments authorized for recovery through Rider PF in Case Nos. 17-0032-EL-AIR, et al., the revenue requirement shall be allocated based on the percentage of base distribution revenues approved in the Company's last rate case, (61.99648 percent to Residential Service consumers), and then billed to residential and non-residential consumers using a fixed monthly distribution charge.
- c. Upon approval of this Stipulation, the Company will file its Rider PF Component Two compliance tariff as part of an EL-ATA proceeding to reflect the allocation of the revenue requirement based on a percentage of base distribution revenues approved in Duke Energy Ohio's last distribution rate case and then billed using a fixed monthly distribution charge.

Accordingly, the Company files this compliance tariff. In addition to this substantive modification, the Company also takes this opportunity to make a purely administrative change to amend the full name of the rider to "Power Future Initiatives Rider."
