

Notice of Proposed Major Utility Facility

The Preferred Route of the Bethel-Batavia Project is 15.5 miles long and the Alternate Route is 14.2 miles long, both of which would be located in Clermont County. If the project is approved, only one route will be selected by the Ohio Power Siting Board (OPSB) and subsequently constructed. The map on the front shows the two proposed routes.

Please join us to share your comments and questions about the proposed project at the Public Hearing. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the local and evidentiary hearings will both be held using remote access technology that facilitates participation by telephone and/or live video on the internet.

Public Hearing: A public hearing will be held at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 9, 2021, to allow members of the public to give their statements on the Project. There are three ways to "attend" the virtual public hearing:

NOTICE OF PROPOSED MAJOR UTILITY FACILITY

Duke Energy Ohio, Inc. (Duke Energy Ohio or Company) is dedicated to providing safe, clean, and reliable natural gas service to the commu nities it serves. The Bethel-Batavia Pipeline project is being proposed in order to support the growth of demand for natural gas in the eastern portion of the Company's natural gas service area, to provide available and affordable natural gas supply, and support economic development in the Clermont County area. Duke Energy Ohio's application for a certificate to construct, operate, and maintain the C367 Bethel-Batavia Pipeline Project is now pending before the Ohio Power Siting Board (OPSB), under Case No. 20-1411-GA-BTX. This number should be included in all communications with respect to the Project. This notice is a follow up to the initial notice, which was sent to those along both routes, on April 13, 2021.

The Preferred Route of the natural gas pipeline is 15.5 miles long and the Alternate Route is 14.2 miles long, with both routes in Clermont County, Ohio. The proposed pipeline will have an outside diameter of 12.75 inches, a nominal wall thickness of 0.375 inches, and pipe lengths of approximately 40 feet (double random length). The proposed pipeline maximum allowable operating pressure (MAOP) is 535 pound-force per square inch gauge (psig), and the line is planned to operate up to this pressure. Pipeline system design pressure will be 1,000 psig, which means the actual pressure containing capacity of all materials will be 1,000 psig even though the system is not currently intended to operate that high. If the project is approved, only one route will be selected by OPSB and subsequently constructed. The map (enclosed) shows the two proposed routes.

The Board is responsible for reviewing information related to this Project – including input from the public – and determining whether the proposed Project should be approved. There are 2 proposed route corridors at this time, as shown on the accompanying map. The Board will make the final decision regarding route selection. It should be noted that, due to reduced scale and limited detail, this map should be used only as a general guide.

If the application is approved, construction of the Project would begin in late fall / early winter of 2022 and be complete in the late fall / early winter of 2023. Construction on each property typically takes between three to six weeks, but may vary greatly depending on the size of the lot and other factors

The Board has scheduled a virtual public hearing, to be conducted by telephone and live video on the internet, at which it will accept testimony from members of the public. The hearing will be held on Wednesday, June 9, 2021, commencing at 6:00 p.m. If you would like to provide testimony at the public hearing, you must pre-register with the Public
