3.15 Multi-Ring Service

3.15.1 General

Multi-Ring Service will be provided only in Company central offices where facilities permit.

Multi-Ring Service will enable a customer to have as many as three telephone numbers associated with a single exchange service. Customers subscribing to this service will be able to receive calls dialed to two or three separate telephone numbers without having a second or third exchange service. A distinctive ringing pattern will be provided for each of the additional telephone numbers to facilitate identification of incoming calls. A distinctive Call Waiting tone for each additional telephone number will be provided, where facilities permit, to customers subscribing to Call Waiting as defined in Section 2.15 of this tariff.

3.15.2 Regulations

Multi-Ring Service is available to customers with simple residence and non-residence exchange service, except as noted below:

Multi-Ring Service is not available with the following: Multi-line Hunt Groups, Remote Call Forwarding Service, and Customer-Owned Coin Operated Telephone Service (COCOT).

Multi-Ring Service may not be compatible with all types of customer-provided telephone equipment. Some types of customer-provided equipment may not be able to reproduce the distinctive ringing patterns that are sent out from the central office.

Customers subscribing to Multi-Ring Service may subscribe to all Custom Calling Service features available to them. However, regardless of the quantity of telephone numbers associated with a single access line, it can only have one set of Custom Calling features chargeable per access line which are applicable to all the telephone numbers.

3.15.2 Regulations, cont.

A call directed to an off-hook line equipped with Multi-Ring Service will receive busy treatment regardless of which telephone number associated with the access line is dialed.

One distinctive ringing pattern is always associated with the first additional multi-ring number. A different ringing pattern is always associated with the second additional multi-ring number.

Each customer will be entitled to one directory listing with each Multi-Ring number. Listings are subject to regulations specified in Section 1.29 of this tariff. Additional listings will also be provided under the terms and conditions described in Section 1.29.

Multi-Ring Service can only be provided on exchange services originating from the same central office switching machine.

Multi-Ring Service customers subscribing to Call Forwarding, as defined in Section 2.15 of this Tariff, must choose one of the following options when both Multi-Ring Service and the Call Forwarding feature are combined:

- A. Calls to all telephone numbers associated with the service will be forwarded to a single number when Call Forwarding Service is activated.
- B. Calls to the main telephone number only will be forwarded when Call Forwarding Service is activated. Calls to the additional Multi-Ring numbers will continue to ring and may be answered at the customer's premises.

3.16 Remote Call Forwarding (RCF)

- 3.16.1 RCF is a service feature whereby all calls placed to an RCF customer's telephone number (the call forwarding location) are automatically forwarded by the Company central office equipment to a designated terminating station of such RCF customer which is located in an exchange area of the Company or another telephone company. RCF is subject to the following regulations.
 - RCF service cannot terminate on or be forwarded to: A.
 - 1. Coin Service
 - 2. Access services unless otherwise specified in the Access Service Tariff.
 - 3. 700 numbers
 - 4. International telephone numbers
 - Numbers associated with N11 services such as 911, 411, 511, 211 5.
 - Other RCF telephone numbers 6.
 - В. The service is offered from central offices where the Company has arranged the facilities for RCF and is furnished subject to the availability of facilities.
 - C. One primary directory listing, residence or non-residence, as appropriate, will be provided without charge for the exchange in which the RCF central office is located. Additional listings may be provided subject to the provisions in Section 1.29 of this tariff.
 - D. Since the grade of transmission on calls which are remotely forwarded may vary, depending upon the location of the calling party in relation to the terminating station, the Company cannot guarantee transmission on forwarded calls.
 - E. Each RCF feature allows for forwarding one call at a given time. An additional feature is necessary for each additional call to be forwarded simultaneously. The customer must subscribe to sufficient RCF features and facilities at the terminating station to adequately handle calls without impairing, disrupting or deteriorating services offered by the Company.

In the event that the use of RCF causes such impairment, disruption, or deterioration, the Company shall have the right to discontinue forthwith such service without prior notification to the customer.

The Company will not provide identification of the originating telephone number F. to an RCF customer.

SECTION 5 - SPECIAL SERVICE ARRANGEMENTS – LOCAL EXCHANGE SERVICES

5.1 Individual Case Basis Arrangements

Rates for Dedicated Access, Private Line and Central Office Based Virtual PBX Custom (Centrex) service will be determined on an Individual Case Basis (ICB) arrangement and will be developed in response to a bona fide request from a Customer or prospective customer for service that varies from tariffed arrangements. Rates quoted in response to such requests may be different from the tariffed rates specified for such services in the tariff. ICB rates will be offered to Customers in writing and will be made available to similarly situated Customers. These ICB contracts will be filed with the Commission for approval within thirty (30) days after the contract is signed by both the Company and the Customer. All contracts will include the length of the agreement.

5.2 Customer Requested Service Suspensions

At the request of the Customer the Company will suspend incoming and outgoing service on the Customer's access line for a period of time not to exceed one year. The equipment is left in place and directory listings are continued during the suspension period without change. At the Customer's request, the Company will provide the Customer with an intercept recording referring callers to another number. Pursuant to 4901:1-5-12 (A) O.A.C., the intercept recording will take place for not less than 90 days, or until the issuance of a new directory containing the Customer's new telephone number, whichever occurs first. A period of less than 90 days is acceptable if the Customer waives the requirement verbally or in writing. This service is available to Customers at no charge.

The Company will assess a lower monthly rate for Customer Requested Service Suspension as noted below. However, any mileage charges, monthly cable charges or monthly construction charges are still due, without reduction, during the period of suspension.

6.1.1 Late Payment Fees

The Company reserves the right to assess a one-time late payment fee of 1.5% per month on any past due balance. 6.1.2 Returned Check Charge

The Company will charge \$20 for each check returned for insufficient funds. This charge may be waived under appropriate circumstances.

6.1.3 **Deposits**

Navigator does not customarily collect deposits from customers. However, cash deposits may be required from a prospective customer, a presently disconnected customer, or a former customer for the purpose of guaranteeing final payment for service when, in Navigator's judgment, such deposit is necessary. Such deposit could be deemed necessary if, for example, the customer's creditworthiness cannot be established. If a deposit is requested, it may not exceed the estimated charges for two months tariffed services plus 30 percent of the monthly estimated charge for a specified customer.

Deposits held for less than 180 days shall not accrue interest. Interest on intrastate deposits held for 180 days or longer will be handled in accordance with 4901:1-17-05 O.A.C.
