MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF CERTIFICATE EXPIRATION DATE AND MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

I. MOTION FOR EXTENSION

Now comes The City of Sylvania ("The City of Sylvania") and moves that the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("Commission") grant an extension of the December 21, 2006, expiration date of its certificate to provide governmental aggregation services. Inadvertently, the City of Sylvania did not file an application for renewal of Certificate 00-033 (3) within the 30-120 day advance window set forth in rule 4901:1-27-09 of the Ohio Administrative Code ("OAC"). The City of Sylvania filed its renewal application, out of time, on December 4, 2006, and the City of Sylvania seeks an extension of its certificate's expiration date while the Commission is considering the renewal application.

II. MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

The City of Sylvania was granted the authority to provide governmental aggregation services on December 21, 2004, and its current certificate expires on December 21, 2006. Since that time, the City of Sylvania has chosen a supplier for the retail electric services for its residents, and power is flowing to its participants under their aggregation program. Unfortunately, due to an inadvertent oversight with regard to the timing for filing, the City of

Sylvania did not realize that the advance filing date for its certificate renewal has passed. The City of Sylvania filed its renewal application on December 4, 2006. While the Commission considers the renewal, the City of Sylvania requests an extension of the expiration date of its certificate from December 21, 2006 to January 4, 2007, to allow for the thirty day review period from the December 4, 2006 renewal application filing date.

The City of Sylvania's request for an extension is reasonable under the circumstances and should be granted. Should the City's ability to provide aggregation services expire on December 21, 2006, the City of Sylvania's aggregation participants would be at a disadvantage in that they would not be able to receive the most competitive electric rate. Although the City of Sylvania inadvertently failed to file its renewal application within the 30-120 day window as set forth in Rule 4901:1-27-09 (A), in substance there have been no material changes in the City of Sylvania's operation of its aggregation program. Indeed, expect for the automatic expiration date of its Certificate 00-033 (3), the City of Sylvania has done nothing that would warrant suspension or rescission of its authority. Since the City of Sylvania's dilemma has been caused by an inadvertent oversight, an extension would allow the City to obtain renewal of its certificate without causing inconventence to its participants. Indeed, extension of the expiration date is necessary to prevent irreparable harm to the City of Sylvania and its residents, and would prevent disruption in service to City of Sylvania participants. The City of Sylvania respectfully submits that an extension of its certificate expiration date is in the public interest.

Wherefore, the City of Sylvania respectfully urges the Commission to grant the extension.
