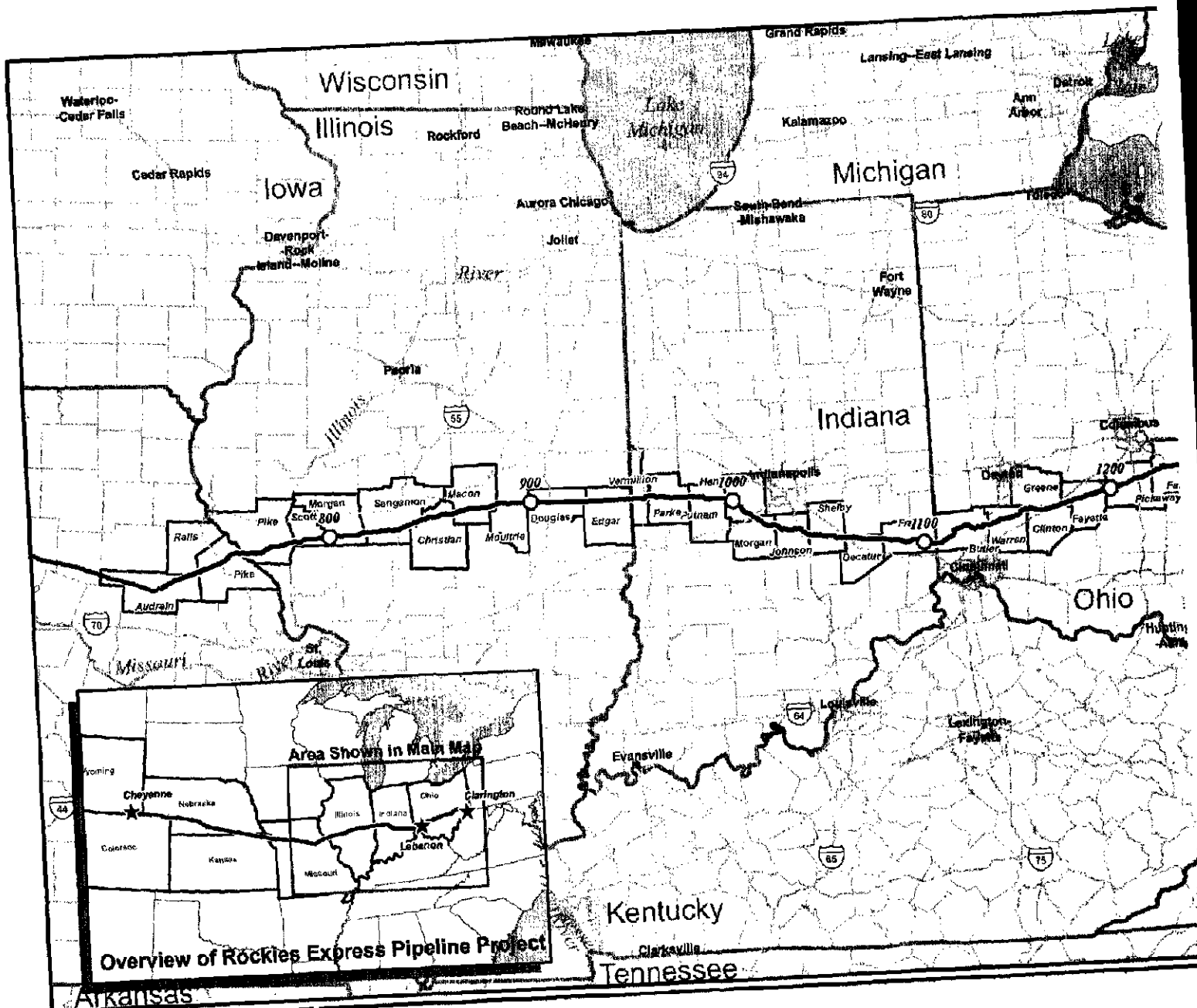

Dear Ms. Bahr:

Rockies Express Pipeline LLC (Rockies Express), a business development of Kinder Morgan Energy Partners, L.P. and Sempra Pipelines and Storage, is developing a new natural gas pipeline system to connect production areas in the Rocky Mountain region of the United States with markets in the Midwest and East. This letter is intended to provide you with a basic introduction to the eastern portion of the Rockies Express Pipeline Project (REX-East), to describe and request your participation in the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's (FERC's) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) pre-filing process, and to initiate consultation with your office under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA).

The REX-East Project is expected to transport from 1.5 billion cubic feet per day (Bcf/d) to as much as 2.0 Bcf/d of natural gas to discrete markets at several commercial hubs and interconnects with major interstate natural gas transmission systems. The REX-East Project will be approximately 622 miles in length and will cross the following four states: Missouri, Illinois, Indiana, and Ohio. The proposed 42-inch-diameter natural gas pipeline will begin at the termination point of the proposed western portion of the Rockies Express West Pipeline Project (REX-West), in Audrain County, Missouri at milepost (MP) 712.7. The REX-East Project pipeline will terminate at approximate MP 1,334.6, located south of Bingham, Ohio, near the Ohio/West Virginia border (Figure 1). In addition to the pipeline route, five compressor stations are proposed.

The REX-East Project is regulated by the FERC under Section 7(c) of the Natural Gas Act (15 USC 717). As such, the project is subject to review under NEPA and Section 106 of the NHPA. Rockies Express, and its environmental consultant, Natural Resource Group, Inc. (NRG), are assisting the FERC in its efforts to comply with NEPA and Section 106 of the NHPA.

Rockies Express will request that the FERC conduct its NEPA review of the REX-East Project under the pre-filing process, which the FERC recently introduced for new energy infrastructure projects. The FERC's pre-filing process is a mechanism to involve relevant agencies and other interested stakeholders at an earlier stage in project development than allowed by the traditional filing approach, with the intent of identifying and resolving

issues before a formal application is filed with the FERC. The process would involve Rockies Express consulting with participating agencies and other stakeholders through meetings, telephone calls, and/or written correspondence, and could also involve a FERC-lead agency scoping meeting(s) prior to Rockies Express filing its FERC application. Rockies Express anticipates conducting public meetings to obtain input from landowners and other interested parties. Rockies Express would then address issues raised by participating agencies and other stakeholders in its FERC application, in addition to providing the required resource assessments.

Rockies Express will assist the FERC in its efforts to comply with Section 106 of the NHPA by conducting background research and a field survey of the proposed pipeline route and ancillary facilities. The survey will be designed to identify cultural resources in the project area and evaluate those resources for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. Background research is on-going and field surveys are scheduled to begin in July/August 2006. NRG retained three cultural resources firms to conduct the archaeological investigations and cultural resources surveys. The Office of the State Archaeologist (OSA) at the University of Iowa of Iowa City, Iowa will conduct the investigations in Missouri, while Commonwealth Cultural Resources Group, Inc. (CCRG) will examine the Illinois portion of the project. Finally, R. Christopher Goodwin & Associates (RCGA) will complete the cultural resources survey throughout the Indiana and Ohio segments.

An important part of the Section 106 review process is consultation with Indian tribes and other interested parties to identify concerns about historic and cultural properties that could be affected by a project. Therefore, Rockies Express respectfully requests your input regarding the potential of the REX-East Project to affect significant historic sites or properties of cultural or religious significance.

Your participation in the NEPA pre-filing process will allow Rockies Express to prepare a more comprehensive FERC application. Therefore, Rockies Express invites your participation in the pre-filing process in addition to your participation in the Section 106 review process. 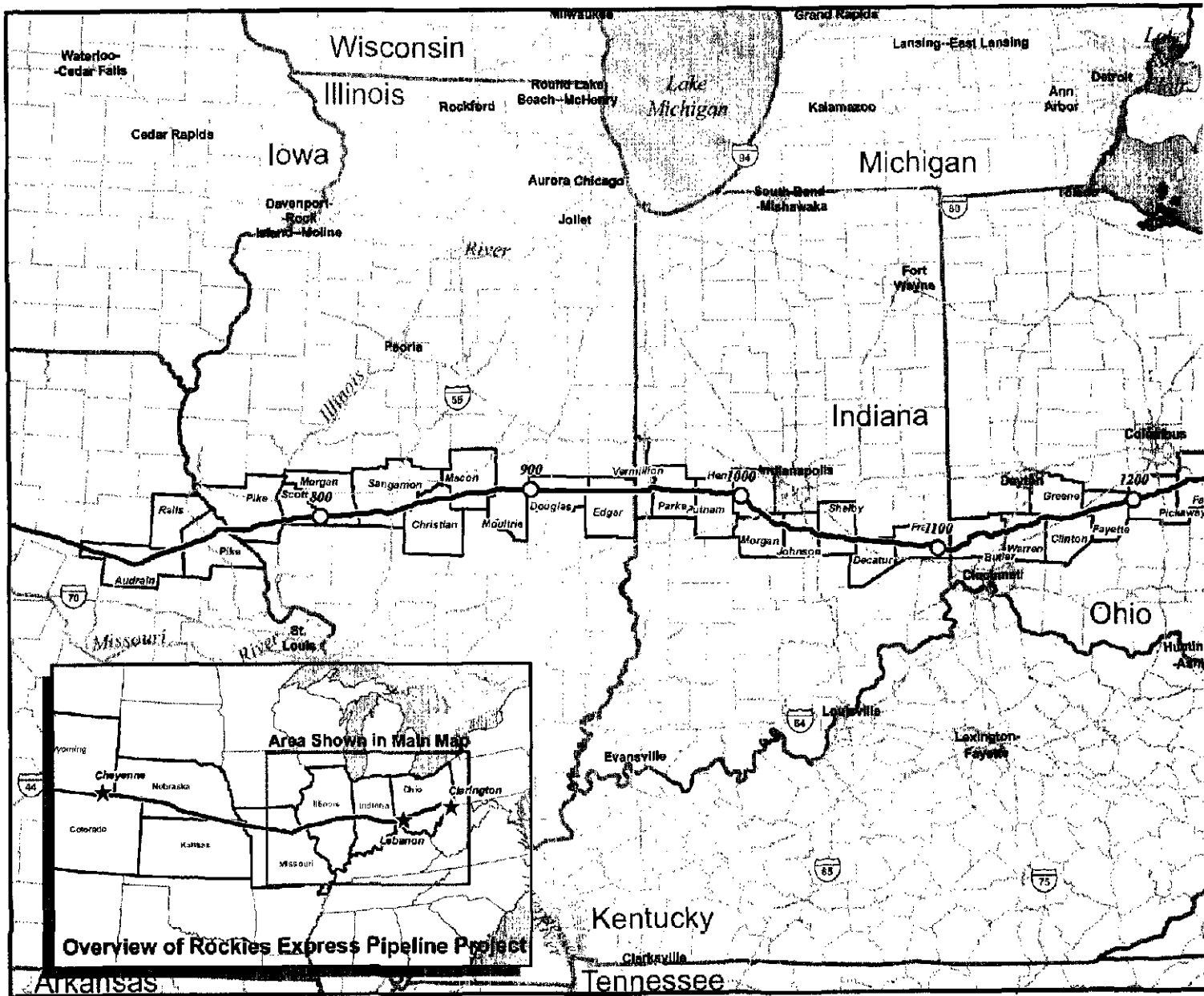

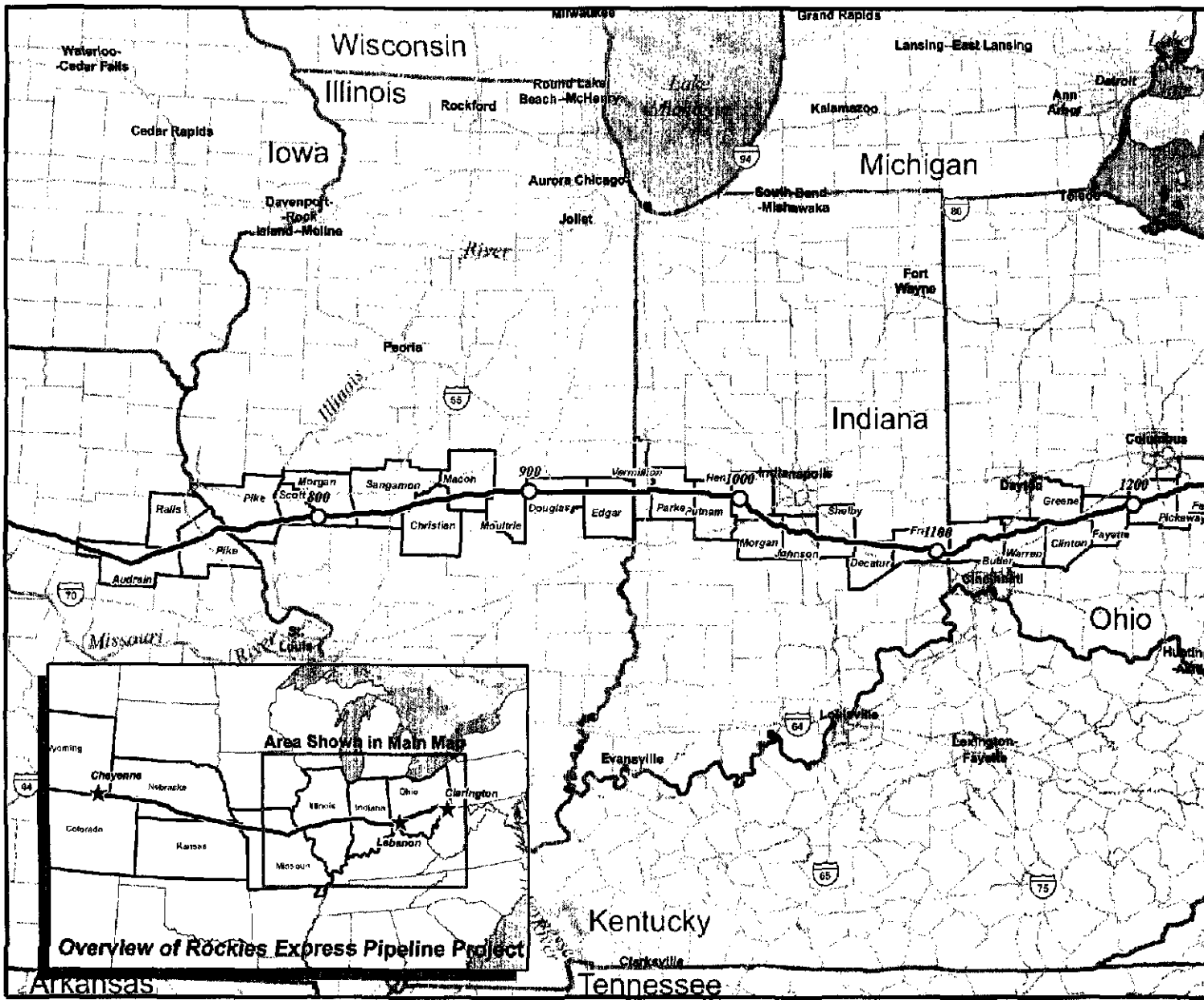

Thank you for the copy of the May 10, 2006 letter and map concerning the above-referenced project.

The project covers only four counties in which the Sac and Fox Nation has historic interest: Pike, Ralls, and Audrain in Missouri and Pike in Illinois. The route does not affect any other of our historic territories.

My concern in any project is whether the land has previously been developed. In such cases any findings would likely have occurred at the time of the original development, whereas previously undeveloped land has the potential of still possessing sites significant to us.

The counties listed are areas of great historic presence and significance where human remains and sacred sites have already been found. Our burial mounds and former village sites are on both sides of the Mississippi.

Our burial practices were such that shorelines are often burial sites. Therefore, special care should be taken in the beginning stage of this project.

The proposed 42-inch-diameter natural gas pipeline will begin at the termination point of the proposed western portion of the Rockies Express West Pipeline Project (REX-West), in Audrain County, Missouri at milepost (MP) 712.7. The REX-East Project pipeline will terminate at approximate MP 1,334.6, located south of Bingham, Ohio, near the Ohio/West Virginia border (Figure 1). 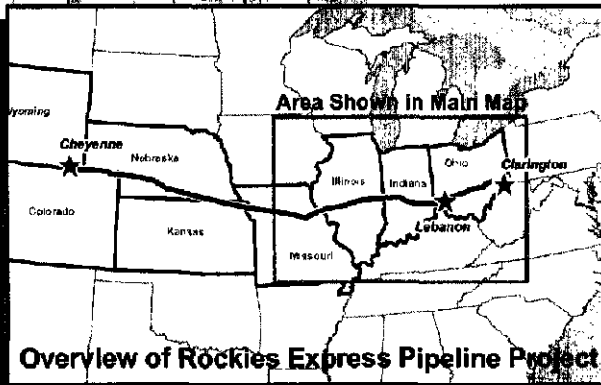

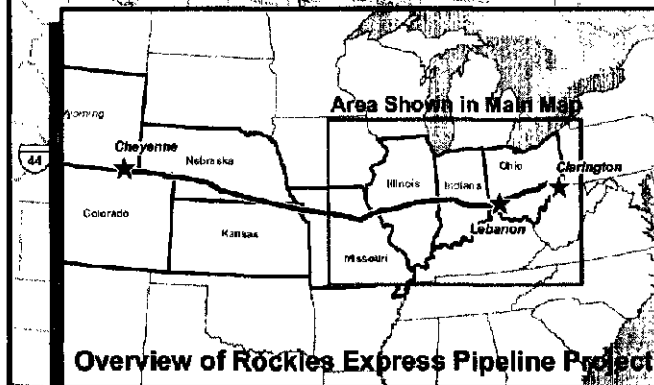

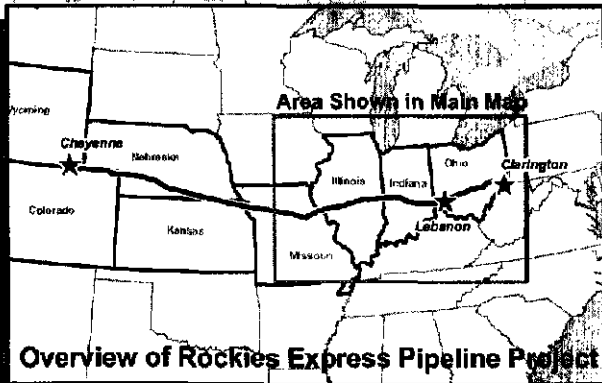

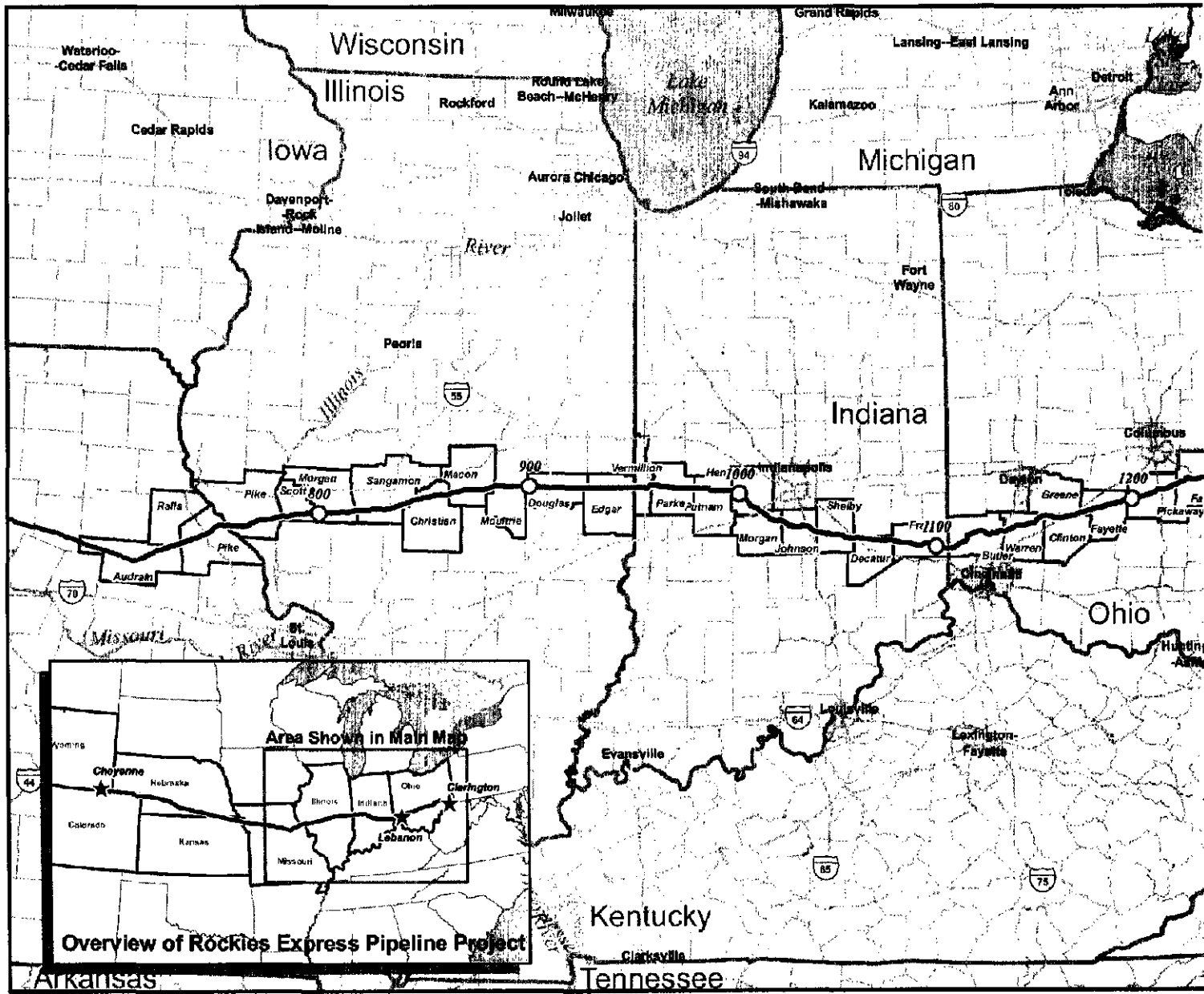

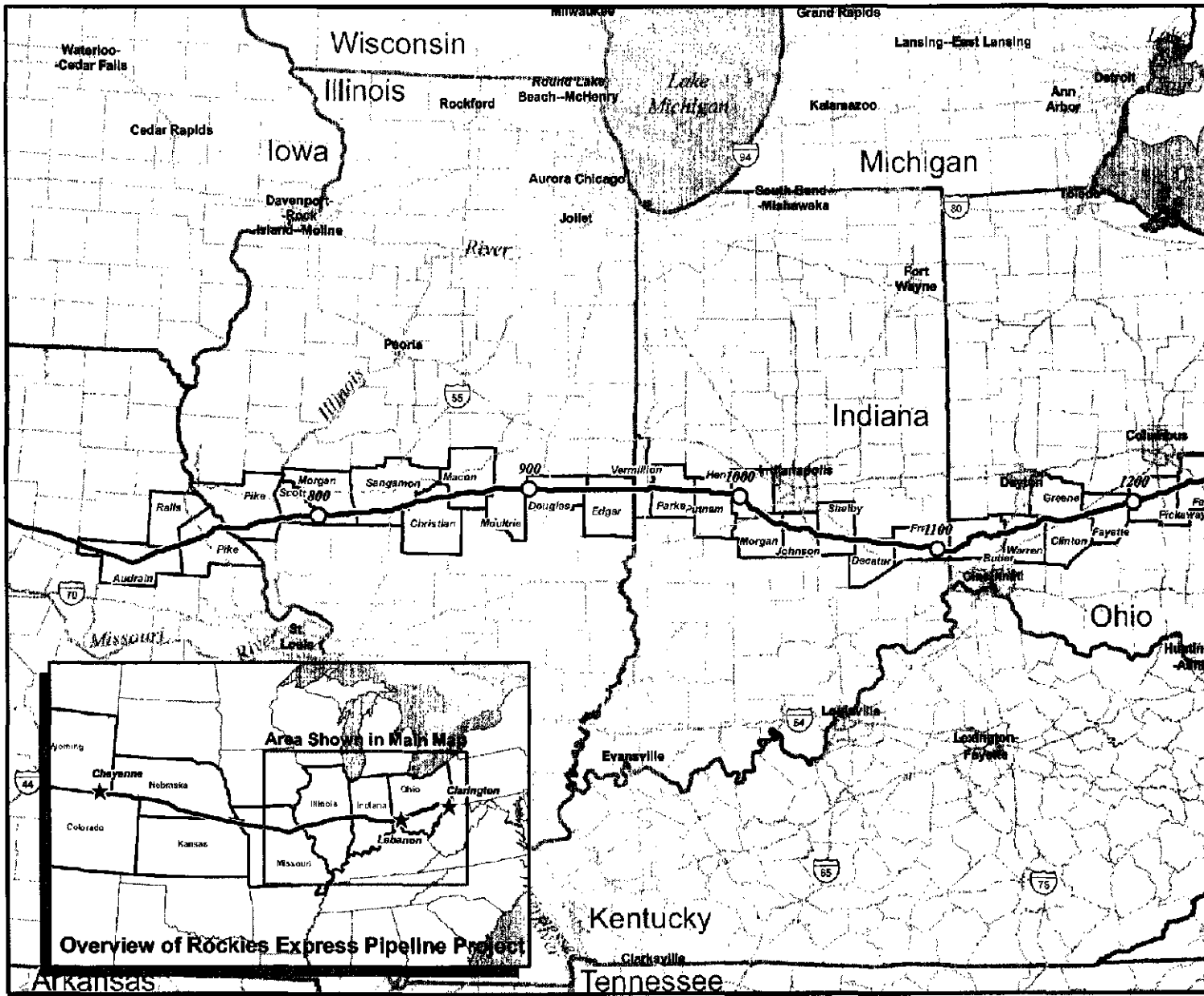

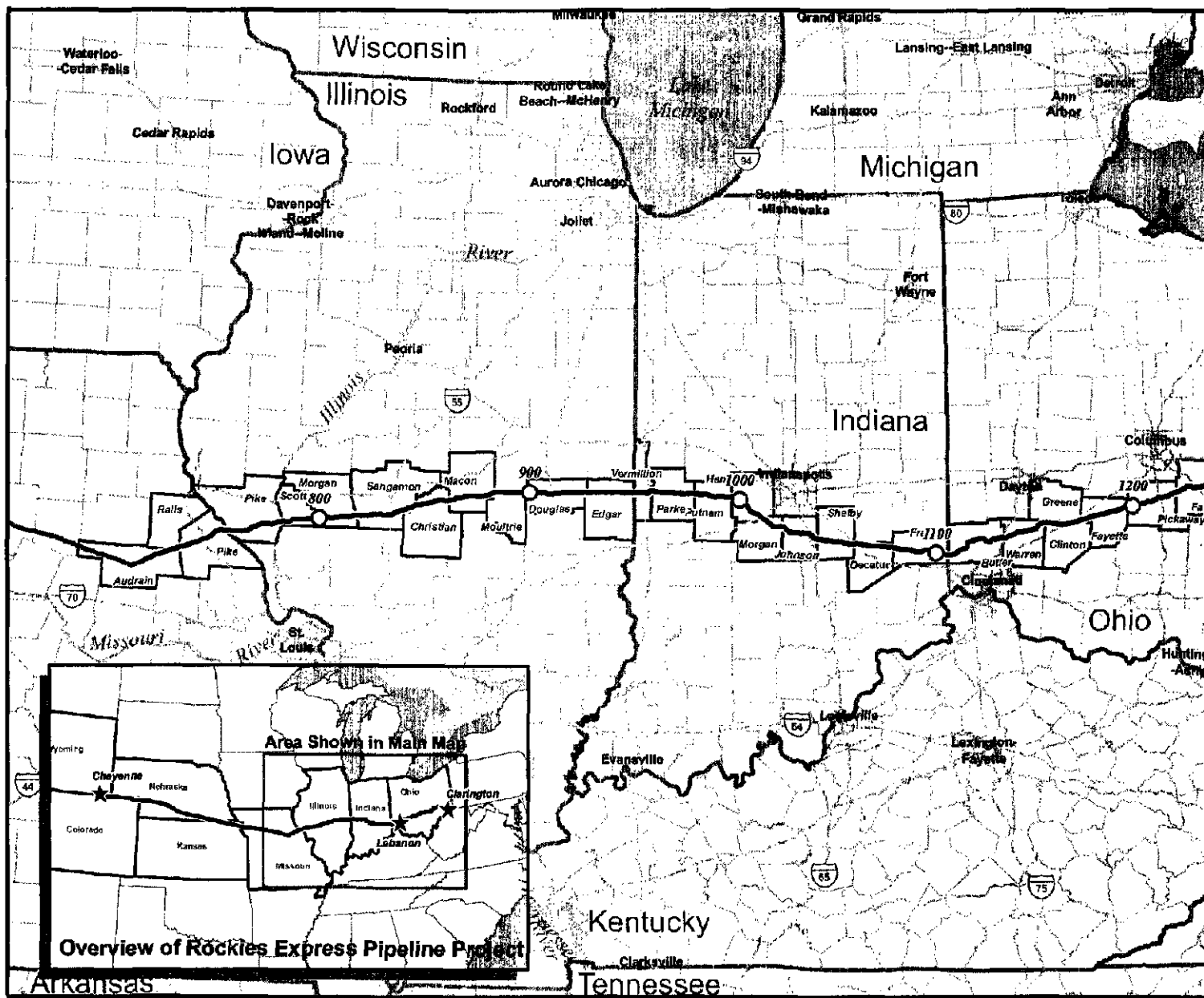

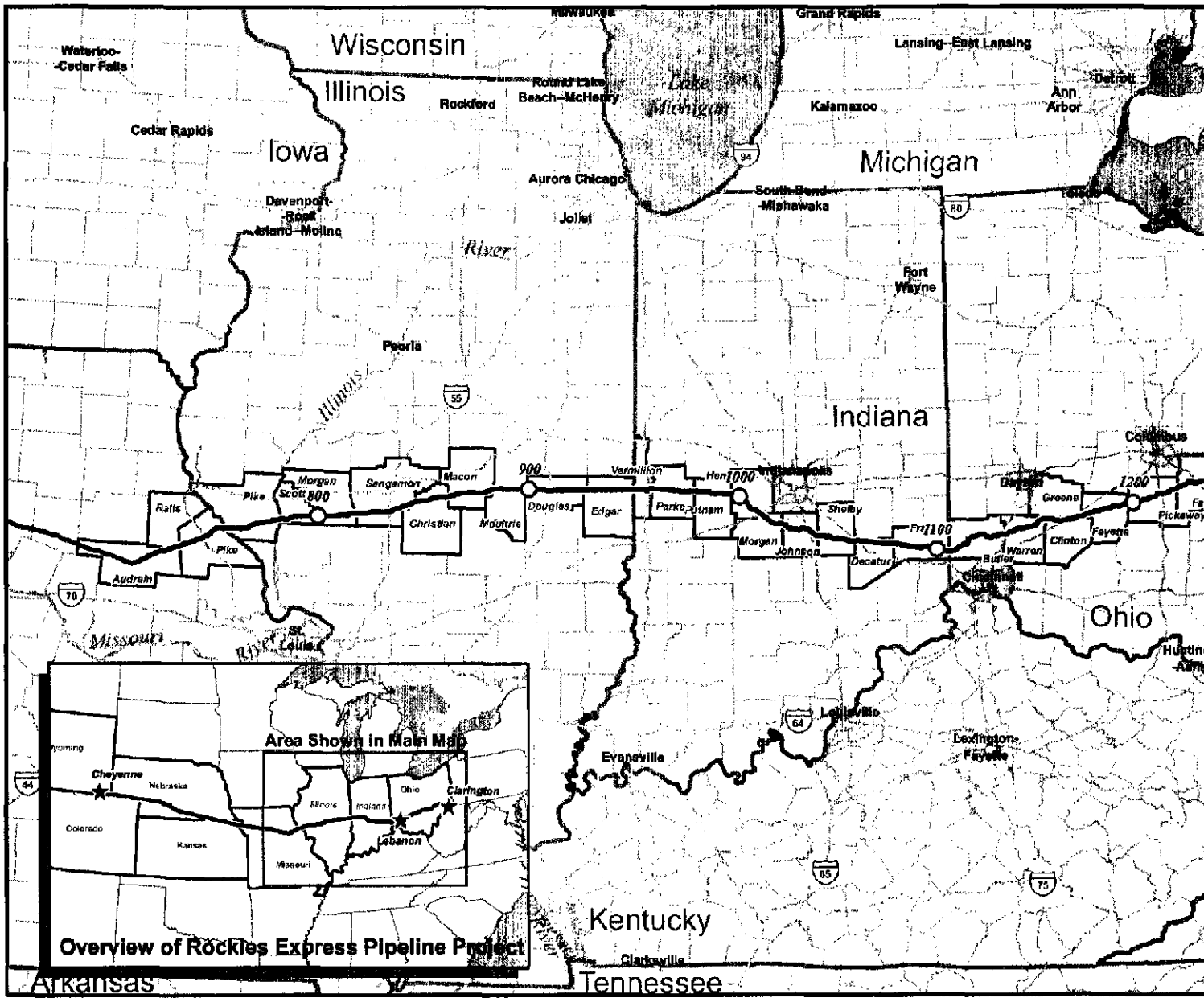

Rockies Express Pipeline LLC (Rockies Express), a business development of Kinder Morgan Energy Partners, L.P. and Sempra Pipelines and Storage, is developing a new natural gas pipeline system to connect production areas in the Rocky Mountain region of the United States with markets in the Midwest and East. The REX-East Project will be approximately 622 miles in length and will cross the following four states: Missouri, Illinois, Indiana, and Ohio. The proposed 42-inch-diameter natural gas pipeline will begin at the termination point of the proposed western portion of the Rockies Express West Pipeline Project (REX-West), in Audrain County, Missouri at milepost (MP) 712.7. The REX-East Project pipeline will terminate at approximate MP 1,334.6, located south of Bingham, Ohio, near the Ohio/West Virginia border (Figure 1). In addition to the pipeline route, five compressor stations are proposed.

The REX-East Project is regulated by the FERC under Section 7(c) of the Natural Gas Act (15 USC 717). As such, the project is subject to review under NEPA and Section 106 of the NHPA. Rockies Express, and its environmental consultant, Natural Resource Group, Inc. (NRG), are assisting the FERC in its efforts to comply with NEPA and Section 106 of the NHPA.

Rockies Express will request that the FERC conduct its NEPA review of the REX-East Project under the pre-filing process, which the FERC recently introduced for new energy infrastructure projects. The FERC's pre-filing process is a mechanism to involve relevant agencies and other interested stakeholders at an earlier stage in project development than allowed by the traditional filing approach, with the intent of identifying and resolving

issues before a formal application is filed with the FERC. The process would involve Rockies Express consulting with participating agencies and other stakeholders through meetings, telephone calls, and/or written correspondence, and could also involve a FERC-lead agency scoping meeting(s) prior to Rockies Express filing its FERC application. Rockies Express anticipates conducting public meetings to obtain input from landowners and other interested parties. Rockies Express would then address issues raised by participating agencies and other stakeholders in its FERC application, in addition to providing the required resource assessments.

Rockies Express will assist the FERC in its efforts to comply with Section 106 of the NHPA by conducting background research and a field survey of the proposed pipeline route and ancillary facilities. The survey will be designed to identify cultural resources in the project area and evaluate those resources for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. Background research is on-going and field surveys are scheduled to begin in July/August 2006. NRG retained three cultural resources firms to conduct the archaeological investigations and cultural resources surveys. The Office of the State Archaeologist (OSA) at the University of Iowa of Iowa City, Iowa will conduct the investigations in Missouri, while Commonwealth Cultural Resources Group, Inc. (CCRG) will examine the Illinois portion of the project. Finally, R. Christopher Goodwin & Associates (RCGA) will complete the cultural resources survey throughout the Indiana and Ohio segments.

An important part of the Section 106 review process is consultation with Indian tribes and other interested parties to identify concerns about historic and cultural properties that could be affected by a project. Therefore, Rockies Express respectfully requests your input regarding the potential of the REX-East Project to affect significant historic sites or properties of cultural or religious significance.

Your participation in the NEPA pre-filing process will allow Rockies Express to prepare a more comprehensive FERC application. Therefore, Rockies Express invites your participation in the pre-filing process in addition to your participation in the Section 106 review process. 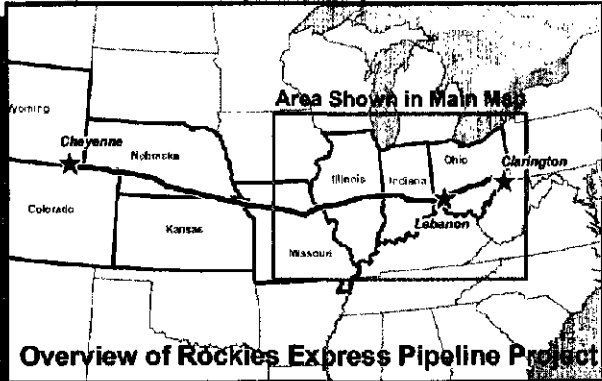

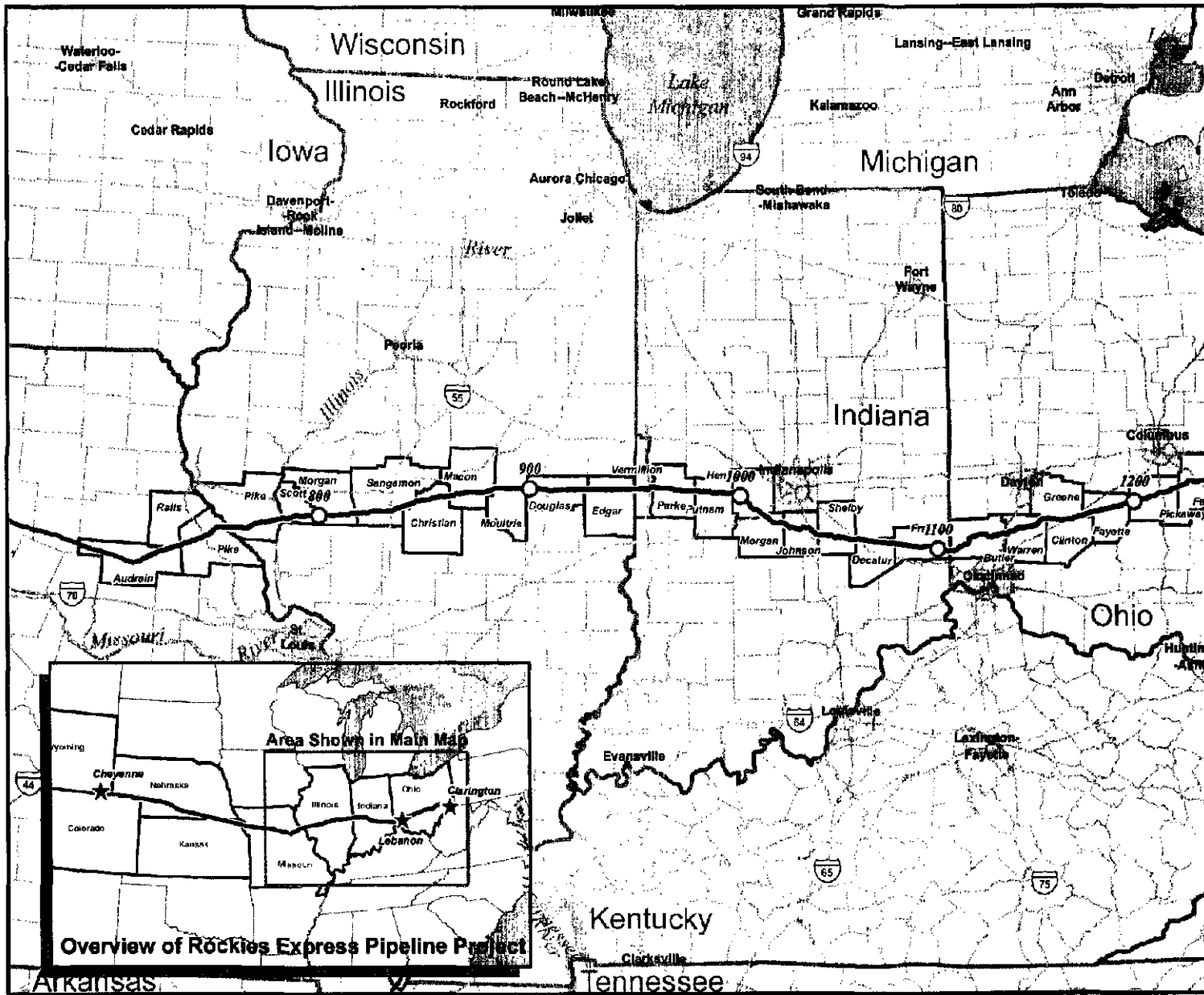

Section 106 of the Historic Preservation Act requires private companies and public agencies to consult with Native American Tribes on projects regulated or funded by a federal agency. The Delaware Nation takes great interest in protecting Delaware patrimonial sites. Due to this we have worked with private companies and public agencies over the past few years. We have provided valuable information to different entities on the location of important sites as well as consistently replied to inquiries.

As a contractor, you are aware of the expenses that are incurred to provide your professional services. The Delaware Nation is also being asked to provide a professional service and therefore, should be compensated for their expertise. Our fee of \$200.00 dollars per site will be sufficient to offset our time and expenses.

This fee will help us to perform an initial review service for each project and ensure that your written request is promptly reviewed and responded to within 30 days via written correspondence. The fee will also obligate us to continue with the consultation process should further information and involvement be necessary.

In a letter dated May 10, 2006, Kinder Morgan Pipeline Energy Partners LP invited you to participate in the consultation process for the Rockies Express East (REX East) Pipeline project as part of FERC's National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) pre-filing process, and requested the initiation of consultation with your office under Section 106 of the NHPA.

In case you are unfamiliar with the letter, the REX East pipeline is expected to transport from 1.5 billion cubic feet per day (Bcfd) to as much as 2.0 Bcfd to discrete markets at several commercial hubs and interconnects with major interstate natural gas transmission systems. The REX-East Project is expected to transport from 1.5 billion cubic feet per day (Bcf/d) to as much as 2.0 Bcf/d of natural gas to discrete markets at several commercial hubs and interconnects with major interstate natural gas transmission systems. The REX-East Project will be approximately 622 miles in length and will cross the following four states: Missouri, Illinois, Indiana, and Ohio. The proposed 42-inch-diameter natural gas pipeline will begin at the termination point of the proposed western portion of the Rockies Express West Pipeline Project (REX-West), in Audrain County, Missouri at milepost (MP) 712.7. The REX-East Project pipeline will terminate at approximate MP 1,334.6, located south of Bingham, Ohio, near the Ohio/West Virginia border (Figure 1). In addition to the pipeline route, five compressor stations are proposed.

The REX-East Project is regulated by the FERC under Section 7(c) of the Natural Gas Act (15 USC 717). As such, the project is subject to review under NEPA and Section 106 of the NHPA. Rockies Express, and its environmental consultant, Natural Resource Group, Inc. (NRG), are assisting the FERC in its efforts to comply with NEPA and Section 106 of the NHPA.

Rockies Express will request that the FERC conduct its NEPA review of the REX-East Project under the pre-filing process, which the FERC recently introduced for new energy infrastructure projects. The FERC's pre-filing process is a mechanism to involve relevant agencies and other interested stakeholders at an earlier stage in project development than allowed by the traditional filing approach, with the intent of identifying and resolving

issues before a formal application is filed with the FERC. The process would involve Rockies Express consulting with participating agencies and other stakeholders through meetings, telephone calls, and/or written correspondence, and could also involve a FERC-lead agency scoping meeting(s) prior to Rockies Express filing its FERC application. Rockies Express anticipates conducting public meetings to obtain input from landowners and other interested parties. Rockies Express would then address issues raised by participating agencies and other stakeholders in its FERC application, in addition to providing the required resource assessments.

Rockies Express will assist the FERC in its efforts to comply with Section 106 of the NHPA by conducting background research and a field survey of the proposed pipeline route and ancillary facilities. The survey will be designed to identify cultural resources in the project area and evaluate those resources for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. Background research is on-going and field surveys are scheduled to begin in July/August 2006. NRG retained three cultural resources firms to conduct the archaeological investigations and cultural resources surveys. The Office of the State Archaeologist (OSA) at the University of Iowa of Iowa City, Iowa will conduct the investigations in Missouri, while Commonwealth Cultural Resources Group, Inc. (CCRG) will examine the Illinois portion of the project. Finally, R. Christopher Goodwin & Associates (RCGA) will complete the cultural resources survey throughout the Indiana and Ohio segments.

An important part of the Section 106 review process is consultation with Indian tribes and other interested parties to identify concerns about historic and cultural properties that could be affected by a project. Therefore, Rockies Express respectfully requests your input regarding the potential of the REX-East Project to affect significant historic sites or properties of cultural or religious significance.

Your participation in the NEPA pre-filing process will allow Rockies Express to prepare a more comprehensive FERC application. Therefore, Rockies Express invites your participation in the pre-filing process in addition to your participation in the Section 106 review process. 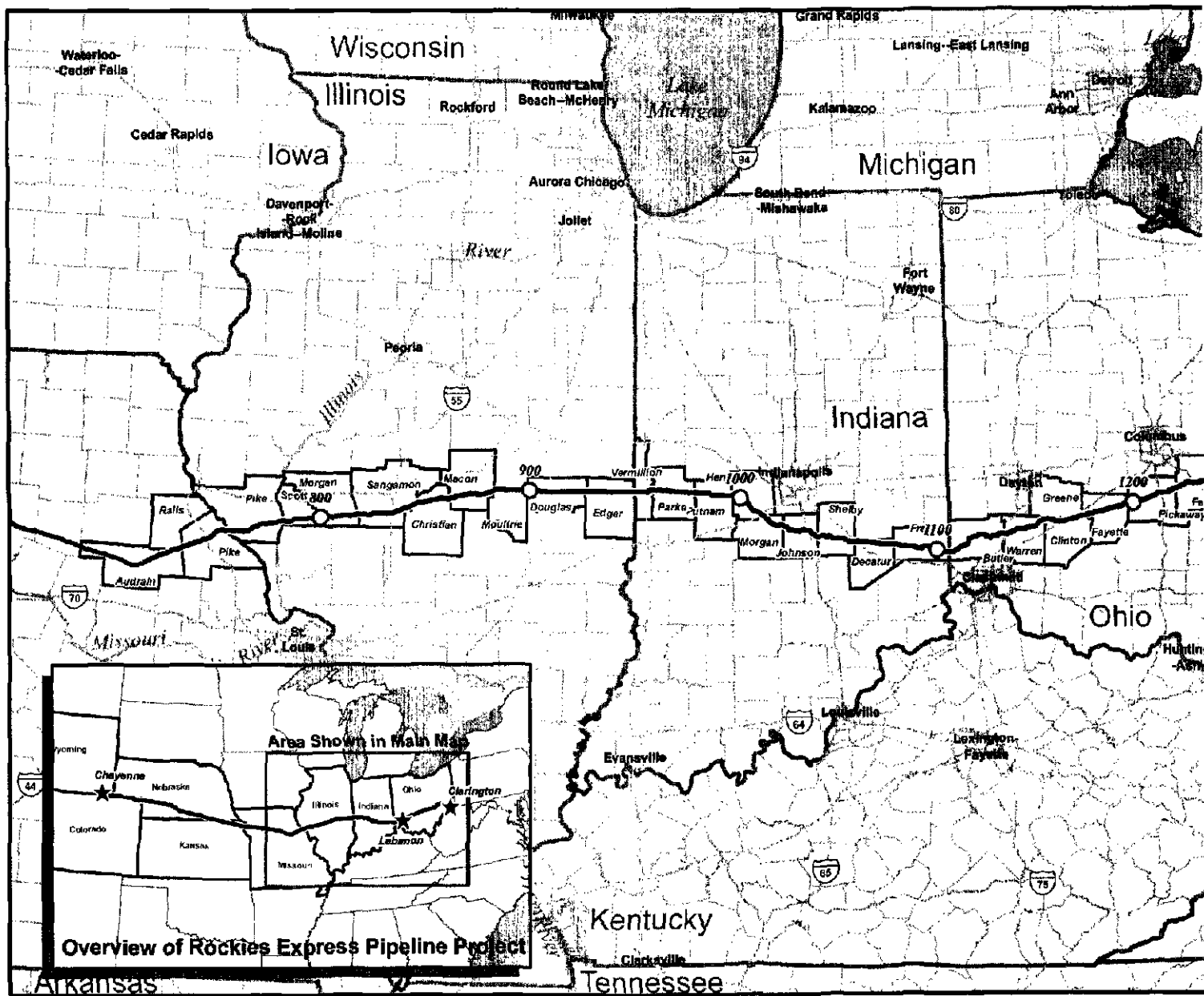

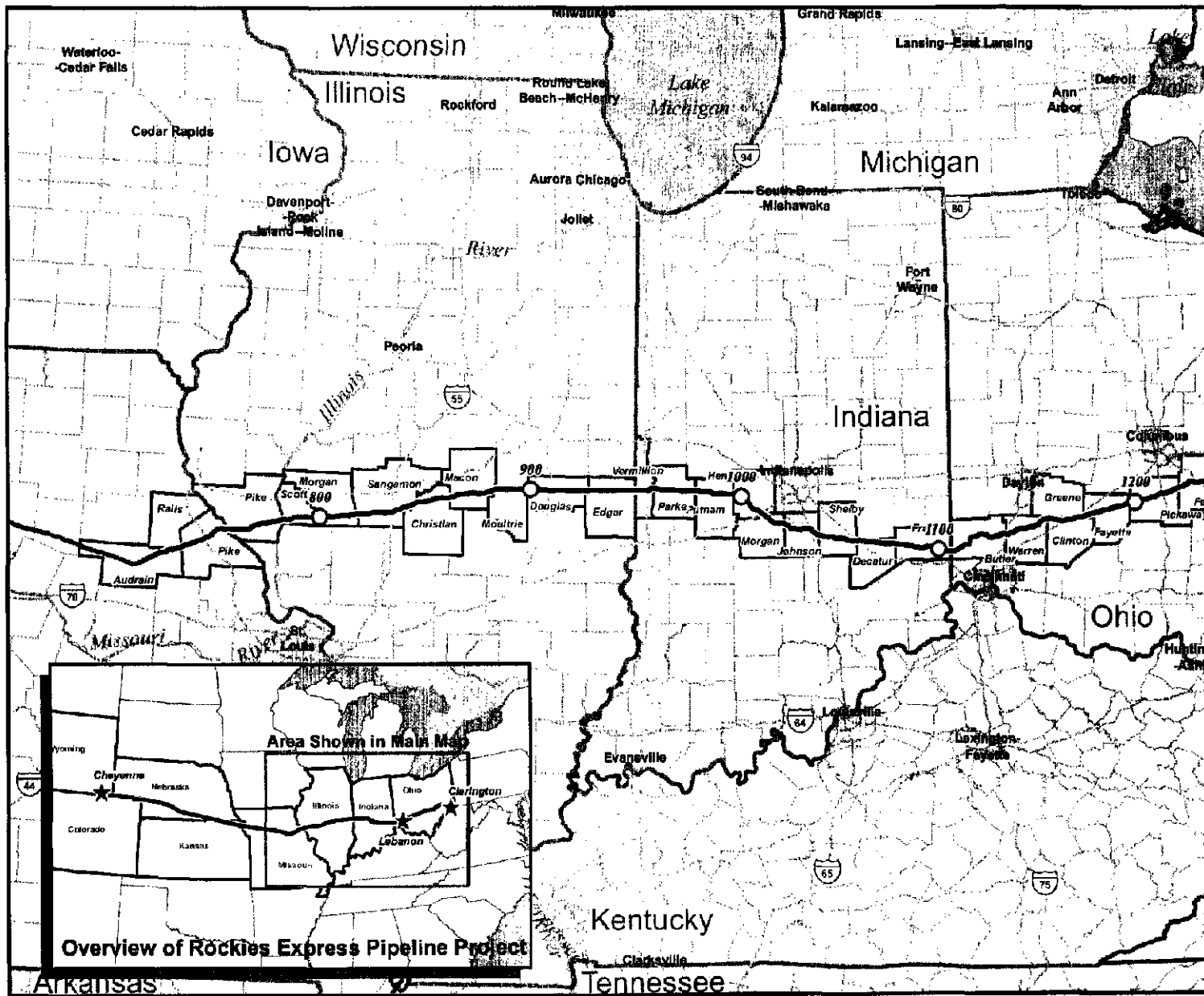
