ENTRY

The attorney examiner finds:

- (1) By entry of April 10, 2006, the Commission ordered CSX Transportation (CSX) to initiate a corridor project in the city of Oxford, Butler County involving the installation of lights and gates at the grade crossings located at East Chestnut Street (154-079C), State Route 732/Main Street (154-080W), West Central Avenue (154-081D), and the upgrade of circuitry at the West Spring Street grade crossing (154-083S). CSX was directed to complete the project by April 10, 2007.
- (2) On March 19, 2007, CSX filed a request for a 30-day extension of time until May 10, 2007, to complete the project. CSX indicated that the improvements at the crossings have been delayed due to design complexities of the signal equipment, delays in approval of construction, and coordination issues with the local electric utility. CSX anticipates that it should have the project in service by April 10, 2007.
- (3) On March 19, 2007, Commission staff filed a memorandum recommending that the extension request be approved.
- (4) The attorney examiner finds good cause to grant the 30-day extension request. Accordingly, the deadline for completion of this project should be extended to May 10, 2007. Staff should monitor the work at this crossing to insure that the project is completed with as little delay as possible.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That CSX be granted an extension of time until April 10, 2007, to complete the project. It is, further,

ORDERED, That a copy of this entry be served upon all parties of record.
