THE EXAMINER: The Public Utilities

Commission of Ohio has set for hearing at this time and place case number 07-127-TR-CVF, In the Matter of Stephen Krilyno, it's K-r-i-l-y-n-o. My name is Kerry Sheets, I'm an attorney-examiner, and I've been assigned to hear this case.

May I now have the appearances of the parties, please.

MR. BEELER: Thank you, your Honor. On behalf of the Staff, Marc Dann, Ohio Attorney
General, Duane Luckey, Section Chief, Public
Utilities Section, Steve Beeler and John Jones,
Assistant Attorneys General, 180 East Broad Street,
Columbus, Ohio 43215.

THE EXAMINER: Let the record show there are no other parties in the hearing room at this time.

Are we prepared to go forward, gentlemen?

MR. BEELER: Your Honor, we have a

preliminary matter. We would like to move for a

default judgment in this case pursuant to 4901:2-7-14

which reads, in section (A), "A respondent who has requested an administrative hearing and fails to participate in the hearing proceeding shall be in default. A respondent in default shall be deemed to have admitted the occurrence of the violation and waived all further rights to contest liability to the state for the forfeiture described in the notice."

Furthermore, section (B) states "A respondent in default shall be deemed to have admitted the occurrence of a violation and waived all further rights to contest the making of the order described in the notice."

Furthermore, section (D) states "If a respondent is in default, the Commission may, on its own motion and without prior notification to respondent, make an order adopting the remedy set out in the notice with respect to which a default has occurred pursuant to this rule."

THE EXAMINER: Thank you, Mr. Beeler. .

MR. BEELER: And another preliminary matter, your Honor. The Staff would request that briefing be waived in this case because we've moved for a default and the Respondent is not present at the hearing.

1 THE EXAMINER: Very good. I'll take your 2 motion under advisement for the default judgment, and we can, of course, dispense with briefs in this case. 3 4 But I think we better go ahead and put the case on. 5 MR. BEELER: Okay. Thank you, your No further preliminary matters. 6 7 THE EXAMINER: Call your witness. MR. BEELER: Staff would like to call its 8 first witness, Inspector Jeff Jirles of the Highway 9 10 Patrol. 11 (Witness sworn.) 12 Thank you, your Honor. MR. BEELER: 1.3 TROOPER JEFF JIRLES 14 15 being first duly sworn, as prescribed by law, was 16 examined and testified as follows: 1.7 DIRECT EXAMINATION By Mr. Beeler: 18 Again, Inspector Jirles, could you please 19 Ο. state your full name for the record? 20 21 Trooper Jeff Jirles, the Ohio State 22 Highway Patrol, currently assigned to the Cambridge 23 District headquarters.

Okay. What is your specific position

with the patrol?

- A. I'm a state trooper who also does motor vehicle inspections with regard to Federal Motor Carrier regulations.
- Q. Okay. How long have you been with the patrol?
 - A. Nine years.
- Q. What are your specific duties in that position?
- A. Specifically, I'm assigned to do commercial motor vehicle enforcement, commercial violations on trucks.
- Q. Okay. What sort of training do you have in that area?
- A. I have training that I completed at the Ohio State Highway Patrol Academy, as all troopers have. In addition to that I'm trained also at the academy but for the federal program under the motor carriers, it's called the North American Standards.
- Q. Okay. Could you just describe the inspection process just generally?
- A. Sure. There are general -- generally three types of inspections that we would do, level 1, level 2, and level 3. In this case this was a level

3 inspection where we check the driver's information, meaning his license, does he have a valid medical card, and check his vehicle registration and of the vehicle that he's operating.

Level 2 is where we walk around the vehicle checking lights, safety equipment, a little more in depth.

And a level 1 is a full inspection where we check the truck top to bottom, underneath, suspension, that's -- level 1 is a full inspection.

- Q. What are the reasons for these inspections?
- A. To discover any violations that may be safety related on the highways.
- Q. I have what's been marked as Staff Exhibit 1. I believe you have a copy already.
 - A. Yes, I do.

MR. BEELER: This is for your Honor. At this time I would ask that this Staff Exhibit 1 be marked.

THE EXAMINER: It will be so marked.

(EXHIBIT MARKED FOR IDENTIFICATION.)

MR. BEELER: Thank you, your Honor.

Q. Take just a quick look at this, you know,

- A. Okay, I'm familiar with it.
- Q. So then you recognize this document?
- A. Yes, I do.
- Q. What is this document?
- A. This is a report that I completed on January the 27^{th} , '06, near Cambridge, Ohio.
 - Q. Okay. Is this document a Patrol record?
 - A. Yes, it is.
- Q. Is it kept in the patrol's ordinary course of business?
 - A. Yes, it is.
- Q. Is it the normal practice of the patrol to make this report?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. Is this document in the same condition as when you prepared it?
- A. Generally, yes. This report, when I would have made it, would have had the patrol's information, the State Highway Patrol's information at the top, then we submit it to the Public Utilities Commission and their header would then appear on the top which is what we have here. Everything else is the same.

- Q. Okay. Let's turn to the specifics of this report. Up in the first field I guess above the first bold line, can you explain the information that is contained in that field?
 - A. The top left is the Public Utilities

 Commission header that I was talking about. On the right side is the report number, which is

 OH8006002366, inspection date and time.
 - Q. Okay. And I also see up there that there's an inspection level.
 - A. Correct.

- Q. What's the inspection level?
- A. Level 3, which I discussed earlier, which is a driver-only inspection.
- Q. Okay. And then next to that there it says that is no -- what is that information?
- A. It says, "No HM inspection," meaning there was no hazardous materials on board this vehicle.
- Q. Okay. Now we'll move on to the next field. Can you explain the information in that field?
- A. This is the company information and the driver's information. In this case the company was

identified as Tim's Thunderbirds, owner was Timothy
Ross, his address is listed. And the driver, Stephen
A. Krilyno I believe is how he pronounces it, out of
Kentucky. Correction, out of Connecticut.

- Q. Okay. Moving right on down, explain the next field.
- A. This is the inspection location. It was a roadside inspection on highway 70, Interstate 70, in Guernsey County, milepost 173. This is just outside of Cambridge, Ohio. The driver indicated that he was coming from Rhode Island, his destination was Zanesville, Ohio.
- Q. Okay. The section titled "Vehicle Identification," what does this section mean? What's the information in this section?
- A. This identifies the truck that he was driving, unit 1. There was only one vehicle involved here. Type, TT, it means it was a straight truck. International is under the make. It was a 2005 registered in the state of Indiana. License given.

And off to the right it says "GVWR," that's the gross vehicle weight rating assigned to that vehicle. Vehicles in excess of 10,000 pounds are required to come into our scales for inspection.

This one was 25,500, which required him to come into the scales for inspection.

- Q. Okay. The next section is titled Brake Adjustments, what's the information in that?
- A. There were no brake adjustments taken on this truck.
- Q. Now we're going to move to the section titled "Violations." Can you just basically explain the stop that occurred on the day of the inspection?
- A. Sure. I was working at our Cambridge facility that day. We have two scales at Cambridge, eastbound and westbound, I was working the westbound scales. Out on the roadway but prior to the scales there's an Open and Close sign. Open, the trucks come in. Closed, obviously, the trucks can go by.

In this case the sign was Open and this truck met the requirements of a gross vehicle weight rating in excess of 10,000 pounds, and he failed to stop. He simply drove past.

I stopped him for that violation, had a discussion with him as to what he was doing. He indicated that he was going to Zanesville to buy car parts and -- from an individual and then he was going to resell them on an eBay business with the owner of

this company, Timothy Ross.

Once we determined that he was in commerce in a commercial vehicle and explained to him that he needed to come into the scales, I took him off the side of the road and completed the inspection.

The Violation section that you're asking me about here, these were the violations that I discovered. The first one was avoiding the inspection site or bypassing the scale. No medical certificate; he would have been required under the federal regulations to have a medical certificate. And he would have been required to have a logbook. It says "Driver failed to retain previous 7 days logs. NO LOGS" noted.

That size of a commercial vehicle he would have been required to keep track of his hours of driving and his rest periods, and he didn't have any of that information.

- Q. Okay. And he also didn't have a medical certificate on his possession as well.
- A. Well, beyond his possession, he didn't have one period.
 - Q. Okay. I see there's some other

information in the Violations section that comes after the specific code cites. Can you explain what that information is?

A. There's a, to the right of the section code, a column labeled "St," that would mean that could be a -- I have that checked in the first violation, a state code meaning a violation of the Ohio Revised Code. The Revised Code section would be 4511.121. In addition to violating the federal regulation he violated the state code by not coming into the scale.

Unit D. Those are all marked D because this is a driver inspection. We're just looking at the driver's information in this case. "OOS" means out of service. "N" for no, "Y" for yes. The logging violation placed him out of service.

Verifications would be if the truck had a mechanical violation and someone came and repaired it, we would verify that it was repaired; that didn't apply in this case.

And the next column is Crash, and there was not a crash involved. And then the far right are the descriptions of the violation.

Q. Okay. Moving on to the next section

marked "HazMat." Just explain the information in that section.

- A. This block would be completed if the carrier was transporting HazMat. There was no HazMat on board this vehicle.
 - O. And then the Special Checks box.
- A. Special Checks would be if we had a special program we were doing that would apply, in this case that was not the case.
- Q. The next section, it's titled both "Inspection Notes" and "Special Study Fields," can you explain the information that's in that section?
- A. The Inspection Notes is an area that the inspector can complete if he wants to put notes in there that he may refer to later to keep this report fresh in his mind. I wrote in here that the driver worked for the owner that was listed on page 1, which would be the top of page 1 there, Timothy Ross, Tim's Thunderbirds; stated that he had an eBay business; was traveling from Rhode Island to Zanesville, Ohio, to pick up Thunderbird parts for resale on eBay.

Driver/owner present meaning the driver was present, and that the owner that we spoke to over the phone had never heard of the federal regulations

and was not aware of what he needed to have with regard to logbook, medical certificate, or coming into the scale. He was not aware of any of those regulations.

Q. Okay.

- A. The Special Study field was not completed in that block because this was not a special study case.
- Q. Okay. Then finally we have a box here that says, it's titled "Locally Defined Fields"; explain the information in that.
- A. These are generally yes and no question and answers. For-Hire Carrier? Yes, this was a for-hire carrier. He had a car business of some type where he resold parts on eBay.

The driver city is simply where the driver lives. Photos, there were no photos taken in this case. Reason code: TRAF, that's an abbreviation for traffic meaning he committed a traffic violation, that's why I stopped him.

Fatalities, N for no. Driver state was Connecticut. Supplemental report, N for no. Paper report, N for no. That would -- paper report means -- this was generated by computer, in the event your computer's

not working, you can complete the paper report; that was not done in this case.

Driver's address as listed.

Co-Investigator, if there would have been another inspector on this case, there was not. Replacement Seal would be if the back of the truck was sealed, we broke that to inspect it and put a new seal on it, that did not happen in this case although we did check the truck to make sure there wasn't anything in it, it was empty at the time.

- Q. Okay. And then the last two boxes, you know, just briefly explain what those two fields mean.
- A. The driver in this case was placed out of service, states that he may not drive any commercial vehicle for a period of ten hours, that's based on the violation above of no logbook. As I said, "OOS" stands for out of service. Once he's been placed out of service for no logbook, he's out of service for a ten-hour period so we can guarantee that he gets a ten-hour rest period.

Carrier Certification is the place that the company official, carrier official, would sign, date, and return this information to the Public

Utilities Commission so we know that it got from the 1 driver to the company back to the PUCO. 2 At the time of the inspection this was 3 0. signed and given to the driver, correct? 4 That would have been 5 Α. That box, no. signed by Timothy Ross of Tim's Thunderbirds. The 6 7 bottom of the form, yes, that's where I would have signed. And where it says "Copy Received By" the 8 driver, he would have signed that there. 9 Q. Okay. 10 MR. BEELER: I have no further questions 11 at this point, your Honor. 12 13 THE EXAMINER: Thank you. Do you have another witness? 14 15 MR. JONES: Yes, your Honor, call John 16 Canty. (Witness sworn.) 17 18 JOHN J. CANTY 19 20 being first duly sworn, as prescribed by law, was examined and testified as follows: 21 22 DIRECT EXAMINATION 23 By Mr. Jones:

Would you please state your name for the

- A. Yes. John, middle initial J, last name Canty, C-a-n-t-y.
 - Q. And where do you work?
 - A. Public Utilities Commission of Ohio.
 - Q. What are your title and job duties?
- A. I'm the assistant chief of the Compliance division.
 - Q. And what are your duties and responsibilities in that division?
- A. I supervise the employees who assess the violations that are discovered during commercial motor vehicles.
- Q. And how long have you been in that position?
- A. About 14 years.
 - Q. And what was your training and any certifications you had received prior to taking that position?
 - A. It's been a while. North American
 Standard. I think cargo tank. I don't recall; it's
 been a while since I've taken those.
 - Q. You have ongoing training on the job?
- A. Oh, yes.

As a supervisor. 1 Q. 2 Α. Yes. 3 Ο. All right. MR. JONES: I'll show you Exhibits 2 and 4 3 for this witness. 5 (EXHIBITS MARKED FOR IDENTIFICATION.) 6 7 Mr. Canty, I have marked as Staff Exhibit Q. 2 for identification -- could you please describe 8 that document for the record, please? 9 This is the fine schedule for 10 11 out-of-service violations which we use in the 12 Compliance division to calculate what the fine amount will be for the violations. 13 14 Q. Okay. Now, have you made yourself 1.5 familiar with the examination report in this case? 16 Α. Yes, I have. 17 So you had a chance to review Staff Ο. Exhibit 1 --18 Yes. 19 Α. -- and the information contained therein? 20 0. 21 Α. Yes, I have. 22 Ο. And how is that information received from the field? 23

When the investigator conducts his

inspection, it is then -- the information he puts into his laptop computer is then uploaded to the Public Utilities Commission and then we work from that data which we have in a database here at the PUCO.

- Q. Okay. And so that information's received electronically then --
 - A. Yes.

- Q. -- to your department?
- A. Yes.
- Q. And please walk us through the steps of procedure that's taken, the steps taken by your department once they receive that information for making any determinations as to an assessment for forfeiture.
- A. Okay. This being a non-HazMat inspection, it would be assessed by the computer as opposed to being assessed by a compliance officer. We have a computer program that sifts through all the inspections and looks for the out-of-service violations, matches them up with the fine schedule which is in the computer program, and then generates the fine amount for each inspection.
 - Q. And what violations were an assessment

made for in this case?

- A. I believe it was logbook violation and medical card.
 - Q. Okay.
 - A. Lack of medical card.
- Q. Okay. And where would you find those violations on Staff Exhibit 2?
- A. On the first page under Group 1
 Violations, Record of Duty Status, that would be -there's different violations listed there for logbook
 violations; I believe that was one of the violations
 here. If you look under the fine for that, one group
 violation would be a \$100 fine. And on the second
 page of the exhibit under Group 4 Violations, Medical
 Certificate for the driver, the fine for that is
 \$100. So it was a hundred for each violation for a
 total of \$200.
- Q. Okay. Now, this chart that you're referring to as Staff Exhibit 2, who developed this chart?
- A. I don't recall exactly who it was.

 Someone in the Transportation division years ago,

 probably about ten years ago I would guess. About

 1996, '97.

Q. Now, this chart, Staff Exhibit 2, has an effective date January 2nd, 2005, and the inspection involved in this case occurred on January 27th, 2006. Is Staff Exhibit 2 the chart that was being used at the time for these assessments for this inspection? Is it applicable?

- A. Yes, it is.
- Q. How often are these charts updated?
- A. There's not a regular schedule. It pretty much depends on how often the U.S. Department of Transportation modifies their violations. I believe they made some changes about a year ago and then we changed our assessment chart accordingly. But this is the -- this was the correct schedule at the time.
 - Q. And you checked that yourself?
 - A. Yes, I did.
 - Q. You checked the records?
 - A. Yes, I did.
- Q. So then when your department receives violations according to the Federal Motor Carrier Safety regulations for a driver failing to retain the previous seven days' log violation and a no medical certificate violation, are these the fines, then,

that are normally assessed if you just have one violation of these offenses?

A. Yes.

- Q. Okay. And is this chart then also consistent for the fines that would be levied according to the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. So the procedures that were followed here by your department in assessing the \$200 fine in this case, a hundred for each violation, the procedures, they are consistent, then, with the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. Now also I'll hand you Staff Exhibit 3 for identification. Could you please identify that for the record, please?
- A. Yes, this is what we referred to as the Notice of Preliminary Determination. This is the notice that is sent to the respondent following a conference. I believe the conference was held with the respondent, I'm not sure the date, but the notice of preliminary determination was mailed to him January 26th, 2007, notifying him that we intended to keep the fine amount at \$200.

- Q. And Staff Exhibit 3, what does it indicate there for what the code violations are and what the assessment amount is?
 - A. The violation code for the driver failing to retain previous seven days' logs, violation code for that is 395.8K2. The second violation, no medical certificate, violation code is 391.41A.
 - Q. Okay. And is that consistent with the information provided in Staff Exhibit 1 as to the violations that were noted in this case?
 - A. Yes.

- Q. Okay. And the amount assessed on Staff Exhibit 3?
 - A. Yes, that is correct.
- Q. Okay. And that's the amount that you determined was made up from Staff Exhibit 2 once it was reviewed by your department?
 - A. Correct.
- Q. Okay. Now, looking at Staff Exhibit 3, how is it cross-referenced with Staff Exhibit 1 for purposes of identification?
- A. The case number on Staff Exhibit 3 corresponds to the inspection number on Staff Exhibit 1, it's the same inspection number that was -- of the

inspection that was conducted January 27th, 2006.

Q. And Staff Exhibit 3, is this a document that's kept in the ordinary course of business for your department?

A. Yes, it is.

MR. JONES: Your Honor, that's all the questions I would have for this witness, and I would move for admission of Staff Exhibits 2 and 3.

THE EXAMINER: Thank you. I will admit all Staff exhibits at this time into evidence.

MR. BEELER: Excuse me, you said you would admit all?

THE EXAMINER: Yes.

MR. BEELER: Thank you.
