RE: Change in Boundaries Between Two Exchanges of AT&T Ohio

Dear Ms. Jenkins:

AT&T Ohio (which is the name under which The Ohio Bell Telephone Company does business) (the "Company") hereby files revised maps of both its Cleveland and Hillcrest exchanges, without application, pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code § 4901:1-3-03(F). *Reduced copies of the revised maps, size 8½" x11"*, reflecting the proposed boundary changes are also attached. Both this letter and the reduced maps are being filed in duplicate pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code § 4901:1-3-03(G).

The revised maps reflect the incorporation of portions of AT&T Ohio's Hillcrest Exchange into its Cleveland Exchange. The Company provides the following reason for making this change:

The City of Richmond Heights currently owns all of the land surrounding City Hall. Richmond Heights City Officials requested that telephone service for this land be moved from the Hillcrest exchange to the Cleveland exchange. The City's telephone service originates in the Cleveland exchange today. A new city hall is now under construction within this area and would be in the Hillcrest exchange without this change. Richmond Heights desires that they be able to retain their current telephone numbers including emergency and E911 services.

There are currently 18 DS1 circuits serving a cell tower on City property fed from the Hillcrest. These would be "grandfathered", and future DS1 circuits (because they are not switched) could be provided from the Hillcrest on existing facilities.

The current eastern exchange boundary North of Highland Rd for Hillcrest is 150' east of the Richmond Rd centerline. We will move this boundary line to a point 1672' East of the centerline of Richmond Rd. This will form a north-south line 2677' in length from the centerline of Highland Rd. North to a point on the existing northern boundary for Hillcrest.

A new portion of the northern boundary for Hillcrest will be formed by the centerline of Highland Rd, extending a length of 1672' from the centerline of Richmond Rd to the east. This change will appear on the top Northeast portion of the Cleveland exchange and the Northwest portion of the Hillcrest exchange map.

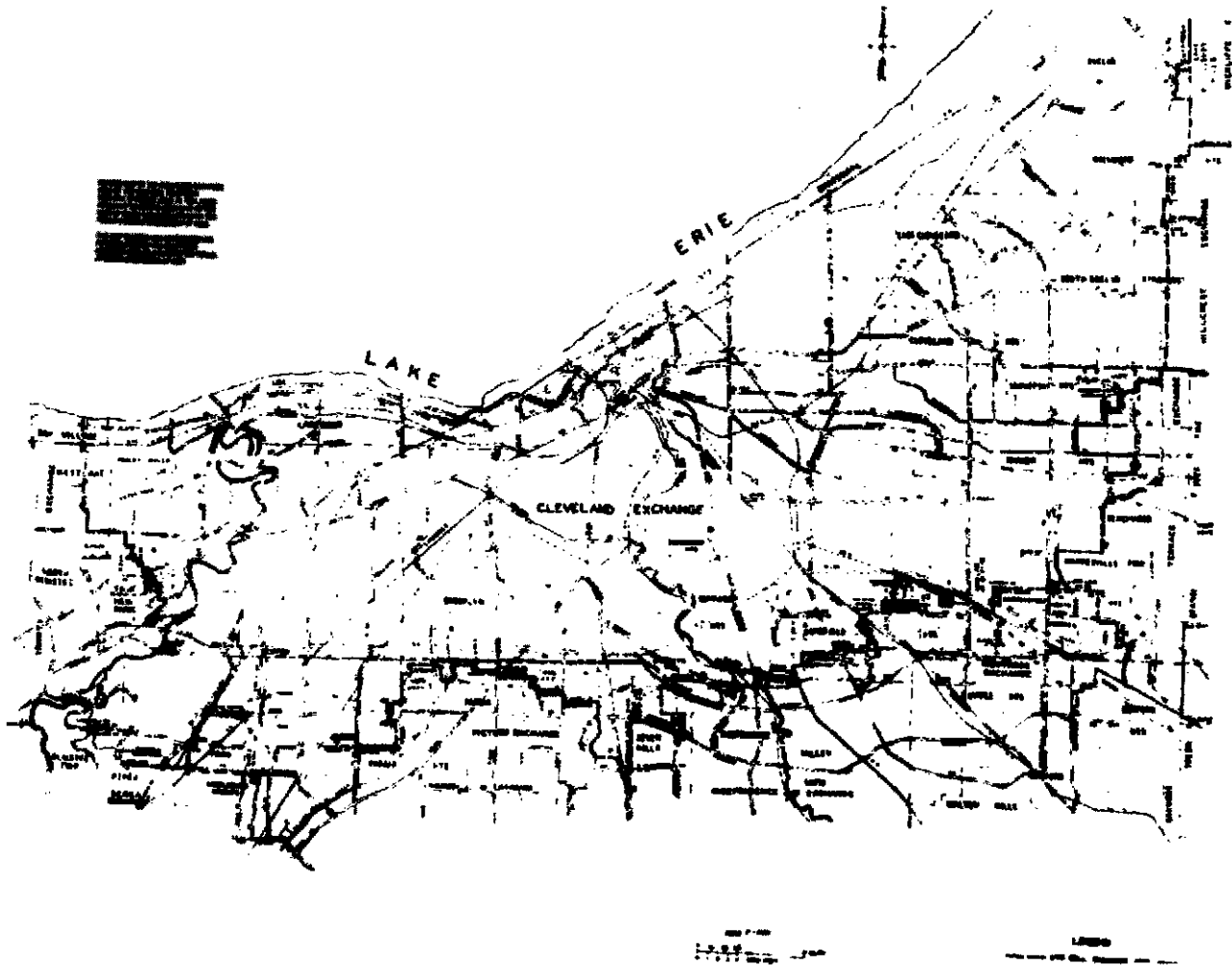

CLEVELAND EXCHANGE AREA MAP



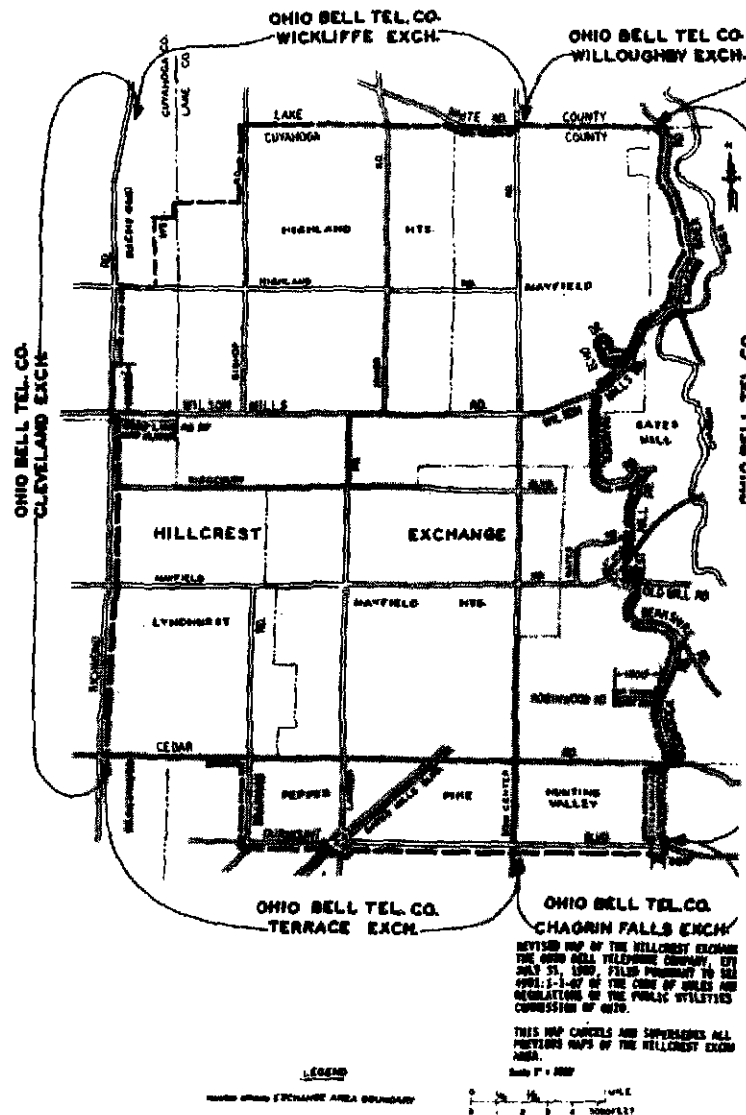
