Name and Description of the Proposed Facility

American Municipal Power-Ohio (AMP-Ohio) proposes to construct a pulverized coal-fired electric power generation plant in Letart Township, Meigs County, Ohio, on apx. 1,000 acres adjacent to the Ohio River. This project is known as the American Municipal Power Generating Station (AMPGS). The proposed project will include a 960 megawatt net power gen-eration plant, a 133 acre landfill and barge handling facilities on and barge nanoung tactimes of the Ohio River. The accompany-ing map depicts the proposed site for the AMPGS facility. It should be noted that due to reduced scale and limited detail this map should be used only as a general guide. More detailed information regarding the general layout of the proposed facility is included in the application, described below, that AMP-Ohio has filed with the Ohio Power Sinng Board.

Application Now Pending

An application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need to construct, operate and maintain the AMPGS facility and maintain the chart of the Office is now pending before the Office Power Siting Board ("Board").
