


Mr. Harrington:

During the week of 6/12/07 I received a call from a representative of your company requesting permission to allow an archeological and biological study on our property to determine the location of an old cemetery containing the burial site of a Civil war soldier and others dating to 1847. I granted permission. That day I met the archeologist there and he requested permission to park his vehicle on the property while he conducted his study that afternoon. I agreed with the provision, since I couldn't remain there, that upon leaving he secure the entrance gate with the provided chain and padlock.

On 7/18/07 another representative of your company called to request permission to conduct a survey on the property. Again I granted that. I went there to observe the process and found that the entrance had not been secured as requested; instead a piece of small rope had been used to hold the gate closed, apparently for the purpose of allowing free access to any other personnel from your company or your affiliates. Located on the property are a log cottage and a utility building containing items of value to my wife and I and an unsecured lane meant the buildings were readily accessible to theft or vandalism.

As a result of the apparent disregard for the rights and requests of us as the owners of the property, I called another of your representatives and informed him that as of that date no representative or affiliate of the Rocky Express Pipeline Co. is allowed on the property for any reason. No trespassing signs have been posted and the proper authorities have been notified of this decision.
